## Rotation of reserved seats soon CEO revises schedule, now ULB rolls to be published on Aug 29

JAMMU, Aug 11: The Election Authorities and the Government are set to order rotation of reserved seats for Municipal and Panchayat elections shortly while Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) PK Pole today extended date for revision and final publication of electoral rolls for ULBs to August 29 from initial August 25 after the officers engaged with revision exercise pointed out certain issues in the list.

State Election Commissioner (SEC) B R Sharma told the Excelsior that reserved seats in Panchayats have to be rotated and an exercise to this effect will be undertaken.

"Reserved seats have to be rotated after every elec-

tion," Sharma said. There has been 33 per cent reservation to women in the Panchayats. Scheduled

## 'Drug menace major challenge'

### Militants' number low, remaining to be neutralised soon: DGP

SRINAGAR, Aug 11: Director General of Police, Dilbag Singh today said that there are the lowest number of militants as of now in Kashmir and they will be neutralised soon but described the Pakistan sponsored drug menace as a major challenge.

Speaking to reporters on the sidelines of 'Meri Matti Mera Desh' event, at Kupwara, the DGP said that a significant progress has been made in curbing militancy in Kashmir so far.

"The number of active militants has been reduced to a two-digit and the remaining will also be neutralized soon," he said. (Contd on page 4 Col 5)

Singh said that the major challenge is being posed by the drug trade in Kashmir. "There, is however, a challenge posed by the rise in drug trade which needs to be tackled by the law enforcement agencies", he said.

The DGP said that after decades of militancy, Pakistan has now shifted its strategy towards a drug war. He, however, said that just like war against militancy was fought, a similar kind of war will be fought against drug mafia.

"War against drugs needs combative efforts. Just like we fought militancy, we will wipe out this drug from J&K, hopefully, but we need the active support," he said. (Contd on page 4 Col 5)

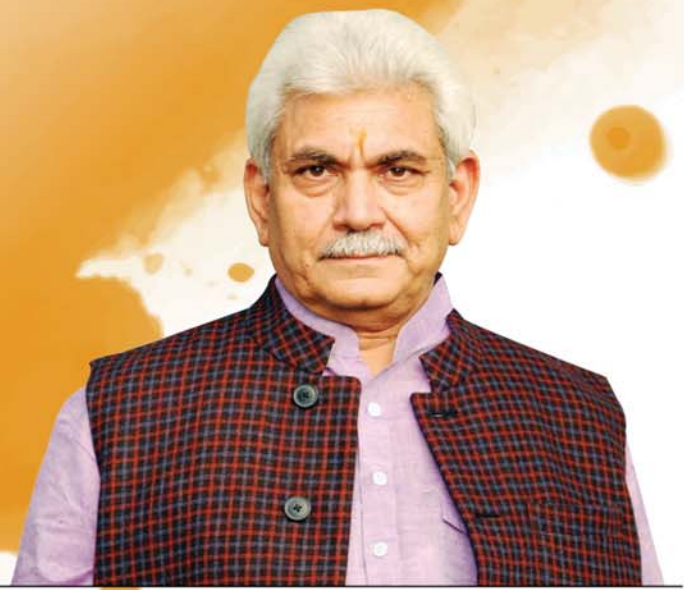
