

Five held, 46 pistols seized in crackdown against arms syndicates

NEW DELHI, Feb 3: including pistols having burst fire mechanism and sold the same to criminals of Delhi, Haryana, Punjab and Rajasthan for Rs 35,000 to Rs 1 lakh per piece," he said.

They said 46 illicit pistols and 36 live cartridges were seized from the accused -- Paramjeet Sehrawat (33), Sanjay (29), Ram Vishnu (23), Anil (22) and Rahul Kumar (27).

Accused Paramjeet Sehrawat, Ram Vishnu, Anil, Sanjay and Rahul Kumar were arrested from Delhi, while Sanjay was nabbed in Madhya Pradesh's Gandhwani area along with 38 illicit pistols of 0.32 bore, two pistols of .30 bore, six single shot pistols, 16 spare magazines and 36 live cartridges.

Six vehicles involved in illegal mining seized

JAMMU, Feb 3: Jammu Police has seized six vehicles involved in illegal mining from different parts of the district. According to a police spokesman, a tipper bearing chassis number MAT0804301N8N22420 was seized by Police Post Chinore and two tractor trolleys without registration number were seized by Police Post Phallian Mandal.

He said one tractor trolley without registration number was seized by Police Post Jourian and one tipper bearing registration number JK02CW-4533 was seized by Police Post Narwal.

The DMO Jammu was also intimidated about the same, he added.

A narcotics carrying Pakistani drone entering into India from along the International Border in Punjab has been shot down by the Border Security Force (BSF) troops today, a senior officer said.

The unmanned aerial vehicle was downed around 2:30 am near border post Rear Kakkar in the Amritsar sector of the state.

A three-kg weighing packet containing suspected heroin has been recovered along with the quadcopter, a BSF spokesperson said. (PTI)

Two peddlers held with 28.25 gms of heroin

JAMMU, Feb 3: Jammu Police today arrested two drug peddlers from different locations of the district and recovered 28.25 grams of heroin from their possession. "During naka checking at Gangyal, a team of Police Station Gangyal constituted under the supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma and led by SHO Gangyal Inspector Ajaz Haider rounded up one suspect namely Krishan Gupta alias Ashu son of Kailash Chand Gupta, resident of House Number 890 (Talab Tillo, Jammu) when he was on his way from Bari Brahmana towards Kunjwani Chowk," a police spokesman said.

Rupee gains 12 paise against US dollar on rally in equities

NEW DELHI, Feb 3: The rupee appreciated 12 paise to close at 82.08 against the US currency on Friday, supported by a rebound in domestic equities and easing crude oil prices. However, corporate dollar demand and weak macroeconomic data weighed on investor sentiments and restricted the sharp gain in the rupee, forex traders said.

During the trading session, the rupee swung between a low of 82.31 and a high of 81.76 against the dollar.

Dilip Parmar, Research Analyst, HDFC Securities said the Indian rupee recovered after touching a three-week low as bargain buying emerged in domestic equities.

The long unwinding in the dollar, and expected intervention along with the weaker crude and dollar index supported the rupee to gain on Friday.

"Next week, the focus will remain on the RBI monetary policy decision after the recent growth-focused budget from the government," Parmar said.

Hardcore drug peddler booked

UDHAMPUR, Feb 3: Police in Udhampur district claimed today that they have booked a hardcore drug peddler under the NDPS Act. SSP Udhampur, Vinod Kumar said that Azhar Chanda of Housing Colony area of the town was one of the notorious drug peddlers and was arrested several times in heinous crimes.

"A dossier with regard to his criminal activities was prepared and submitted before the Divisional Commissioner Jammu, who after careful consideration, ordered his detention under the PIT NDPS Act," said the SSP Udhampur.

MENDHAR, Feb 3: The police arrested a drug-peddler from Mendhar area last evening and recovered some quantity of heroin from his possession.

The team lead by PSI Naveet and SHO Mendhar Insp Nayaz Ahmed intercepted a person and recovered the narcotics from him. A case FIR No. 23/2023 u/s 8/20/22 NDPS Act has been registered at PS Mendhar and investigation started.

It is pertinent to mention here that during last year District Police Poonch registered 55 FIRs against 70 drug peddlers and recovered 107 kg heroin, 1.35 kg charas, 2.40 kg Ganja, 62 kg poppy straw, 9750 Teledyne tablets, 1.57 lakh Indian currency and 170 persons involved in drugs were booked under preventive sections of law.

4 drug peddlers held

SAMBA, Feb 3: Jammu and Kashmir Police in Samba District claimed today that they have arrested four drug peddlers and recovered 200 grams of Ganja and 54 bottles of illicit liquor from their possession.

A police spokesperson identified the arrested drug peddlers as Parshotam Kumar alias Rinku of Teli Basti, Bari Brahmana; Sanjeev Singh of Gurha Slathia, Vijaypur; Satpal Singh of Koulpur, Ramgarh and Jaswinder Singh of Raya, Ramgarh.

"The accused have been booked in two FIRs registered under relevant sections of the NDPS Act and Excise Act," said the police spokesperson.
