emerging from the UK's Sikh communities. A false narrative is disseminated by the tiny number of pro-Khalistan groups operating in the UK that the Government is colluding with its counterpart in India to persecute Sikhs."

"Such groups' narratives glorify violence carried out by the pro-Khalistan movement in India. While the current threat is low, praise for violence overseas and a simultaneous belief in a state-led campaign of repression domestically is a potentially toxic combination for the future."

It comes as the review found that Islamist extremism represents the "primary terrorist threat" to the UK -- "consistently accounting for the majority of terrorist attack plots both carried out and thwarted by the intelligence services".

It noted that at present, 80 per cent of the Counter-Terrorism Police network's live investigations are Islamist while 10 per cent are Extreme Right-Wing.

UK Home Secretary Suella Braverman told the House of Commons on Wednesday that she

intends to "swiftly implement" all of the recommendations from the review into the Prevent strategy, a UK-wide system set up as an early warning system against terrorist threats.

The review is unflinching. Prevent needs major reform. It needs to better understand the threats that we face and the ideology underpinning them, the Indian-origin Minister told MPs.

"The truth is that there is nothing anti-Muslim about tackling Islamism, and we must continue to work closely with Muslim communities if we are to do so effectively," she said.

"While obscuring the Islamist threat, Prevent has defined the extreme right-wing too broadly, encompassing the respectable right and centre-right. The threat from the extreme right-wing must not be minimised. It is serious and it is growing; it must be robustly addressed. But it is not the same, either in nature or in scale, as the threat from Islamism," Braverman added. (PTI)

She said the Budget focuses on the middle class, employment generation, MSME, agri sector, rural population, health and green growth.

Sitharaman said the new tax regime announced in the Budget is "very attractive" as the tax exemption limit has been hiked to Rs 3 lakh, from Rs 2.5 lakh earlier. Besides, a standard deduction of Rs 50,000 too has been allowed under the scheme.

This new tax regime will benefit the majority of middle-class taxpayers, she said, adding that the rebate has been provided on an income of up to Rs 7 lakh.

"Since the enhanced rebate limit is unconditional, it leaves higher disposable income in the hands of people," Sitharaman said.

The PM said that UP, despite its rich culture and history had become a BEMARU (sick) State in the past. India does not reform 'out of compulsion' but 'out of conviction', he said, pointing out that this is the reason why India has abolished more than 40,000 compliances and abrogated dozens of old laws. CIC declares Shiv Khori Shrine Board as Public Authority under RTI Act

Section 2 (h) (b)/(c) of the RTI Act, 2005."

Based on these findings it is also clear that whether the body is financed/ substantially financed by the appropriate Government also becomes immaterial if the Commission is examining if the body is a Public Authority as per Section 2 (h) (a) (i) to (d) (first part), the CIC said, adding hence, the contention of the respondent that it is not financed by the Government does not hold good.

"Clause (b)/(c) of Section 2 (h) is applicable to the facts of the present case. As per the records available, it is clear that the Shrine Board was 'established/ constituted' by way of the Jammu and Kashmir Shiv Khori Shrine Act, 2008 Act enacted on 11.02.2008. As per Section 3 (a) of the Act, the board means the Shiv Khori Shrine Board 'constituted' under the Act, the CIC said.

"The terms of appointment of the board constituents, conditions of disqualification from membership of the board, resignation, removal of members, duties of the board, liability of the members are all defined under the Act", the CIC said, adding Section 19 of the Act states that the members, officers and employees of the Board

shall, while acting or purporting to act in pursuance of the provisions of this Act or any bye-laws made there under, be deemed to be public servants within the meaning of Section 21 of the Indian Penal Code.

"Thus, there is no scope of ambiguity in considering the Shrine Board as a "body" as envisaged within the definition of "Public Authority" under Section 2 (h) of the RTI Act, 2005 and the Government of UT of J&K being the "Appropriate Government" as per the definition under Section 2 (a) of the Act", the CIC further said.

"In view of the facts of the case and the submissions made by both the parties, the Commission decides that Shiv Khori Shrine Board is a Public Authority as per Section 2 (h) of the RTI Act, 2005. The Commission therefore directs the Competent Authority in the board to appoint a PIO/FAA in compliance with the provisions of the RTI Act, 2005 by 15.03.2023. The CPIO thus appointed shall provide the relevant information with respect to the RTI application in accordance with the RTI Act, 2005 within 30 days from the date of his/her appointment", read the order.

NEET-PG will be held on March 5: Mandaviya

NEW DELHI, Feb 10:

The NEET-PG examination will be conducted as per schedule on March 5 for those aspiring to get admission to post-graduate medical courses, Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya told Lok Sabha on Friday.

To ensure that no one is left out, the ministry has extended the cut off date for all those MBBS students who are yet to complete their internship, he said while replying to a question by Congress member Gaurav Gogoi.

Raising the issue in Lok Sabha during the Question Hour, Gogoi sought to know from Mandaviya his ministry's stand on the students' demand for postponement of the NEET-PG 2023 examination for a few months.

"On March 5, the examination has to be conducted and this was declared five months ago. Those students, who had to appear for it (entrance test), are already preparing," the minister said in his response. "Earlier examinations were

delayed by seven-eight months and later by four months...If I keep on delaying, such a situation will come....," he said, adding, "It is very necessary to fix it". The minister said it is very necessary to conduct the entrance test timely.

For those who are yet to complete their internship, Mandaviya said his ministry has already extended the cut-off date.

"I have extended the cut off date so that all students get a chance to appear for the NEET-PG exam, clear it and take admission in PG (postgraduate medical courses)," he said.

A section of NEET-PG aspirants have been demanding postponement of the entrance test, citing delay in completion of their internship.

A group of doctors, including NEET-PG aspirants, held a protest on Jantar Mantar Road on Tuesday under the banner of Federation of All India Medical Association (FAIMA), demanding that the Government postpone the entrance test. (PTI)
