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Govt to come out with Policy to protect small land holders after nod from MHA

sources said. Apart from the anti-encroachment drive, the Union Home Ministry reviewed ongoing projects/works in Jammu and Kashmir under the Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSSs) and Prime Minister's Development Package (PMDP) besides the development works undertaken by the UT administration on its own.

"The Jammu and Kashmir administration briefed the Home Minister about progress on various projects and schemes in the Central as well as UT sectors and J&K Government's directive to executing agencies to meet time-lines," sources said, adding that the Government has assured the UT dispensation that funds would be no problem for the ongoing projects and more schemes which will be announced shortly.

The senior officers from J&K apprised the Home Minister about several services put Online and made time-bound by the administration, benefitting a lot of people.

The issue of transit accommodation for Kashmiri Pandits in the Valley also figured prominently at the meeting with the UT representatives assuring the Home Minister that work is apace and will meet the deadlines.

Only yesterday, Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha directed the administration to release salary of KPs' PM Package employees on the occasion of Maha Shivratri, who have joined duties.

Some security related issues of the Kashmiri Pandits in the

Valley also came up for discussion during the meeting, sources said, adding the migrant employees have been posted at secured places.

The UT administration briefed the Home Minister that representatives of the Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) will be sent to different States of the country to acquaint themselves with working of Panchayats, Block Development Councils and District Development Councils in other States and Union Territories so that they can learn and improve functioning of the PRIs here.

Sources said law and order situation in Jammu and Kashmir was also discussed at the meeting and steps being taken by law and order enforcement agencies including Jammu and Kashmir Police to eliminate the militants and capture the Over Ground Workers (OGWs).

Security agencies gave detailed briefing on ongoing anti-militancy operations in the Kashmir valley and parts of Jammu region including twin border districts of Rajouri and Poonch where two foreign terrorists involved in the killings of seven civilians from minorities at Dhangri, Rajouri on January 1, remained untraced so far.

However, Jammu Police and Rajouri Police have busted two modules of militants responsible for planting the Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs). They include a Government teacher of Reasi district.

SC dismisses plea against constitution of Delimitation Commission in J&K

Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, 2019 does not preclude the establishment of Delimitation Commission by the Central Government.

On March 6, 2020, Union Ministry of Law and Justice (Legislative Department) had issued a notification in exercise of power under Section 3 of the Delimitation Act, 2002, constituting a Delimitation Commission, with former Supreme Court Judge (Retd) Ranjana Prakash Desai as the chairperson.

The Counsel appearing for the two petitioners, Haji Abdul Gani Khan and Mohammad Ayub Mattoo, had argued that the delimitation exercise was carried out in contravention of the scheme of the Constitution and alteration of boundaries and inclusion of extended areas should not have been done.

The plea had sought declaration that the increase in the number of seats from 107 to 114 (including 24 seats in Pakistan occupied Kashmir) in Jammu and Kashmir is ultra vires constitutional provisions and statutory provisions, particularly under section 63 of the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, 2019.

It had said the last Delimitation commission was set up on July 12, 2002 in exercise of

powers conferred by Section 3 of the Delimitation Act, 2002 after the 2001 census to carry out the exercise throughout the country.

The plea had said the commission had issued guidelines and methodology for the delimitation of Assembly and Parliamentary constituencies vide letter dated July 5, 2004 along with the Constitutional and legal provisions.

"It clearly stated that the total number of existing seats in the Legislative Assemblies of all States, including UTs of the National Capital Region and Pondicherry, as fixed based on the 1971 census shall remain unaltered till the first census to be taken after the year 2026," the plea had submitted.

It had sought to declare as unconstitutional the notification dated March 6, 2020 constituting the Delimitation Commission to take up Delimitation in the UT of J-K and States of Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur and Nagaland by the Centre.

The plea had also challenged the consequential omission of Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur and Nagaland from the process of delimitation vide notification dated March 3, 2021, claiming that it amounts to classification and violates Article 14 (equality before law) of the Constitution. (PTI)

Efforts afoot to have built-in satellite tuners in TV sets: I&B Minister Anurag Thakur

MUMBAI, Feb 13: Information and Broadcasting Minister Anurag Thakur today said efforts are afoot to have a built-in satellite tuner in television sets to offer access to over 200 channels, a move that could make set-top boxes redundant.

He said there has been a humongous expansion of general entertainment channels on Free Dish, which has helped attract crores of viewers.

"I have made a new beginning in my department. If your television has a built-in satellite tuner, then there will be no need to have a separate set-top box. One can have access to more than 200 channels at the click of the remote," he told reporters.

The Minister, however, made it clear that the decision in this matter is yet to be taken.

In December last year, Thakur had written to the Electronics and Information Technology Minister Ashwini Vaishnav to issue directions to television manufacturers to adopt the standards issued by the Bureau of Industrial Standards for built-in satellite tuners.

Television sets with built-in satellite tuners would enable reception of free-to-air television and radio channels by mounting a small antenna at a suitable place such as at the rooftop or side wall of a building.

At present, television viewers need to purchase a set-top box for viewing various paid and free channels.

The viewer is required to use a set-top box even for the reception of free-to-air channels (non-encrypted) transmitted by Doordarshan. (PTI)
