

Sankalp Divas observed in Jammu, Delhi

JAMMU/DELHI, Feb 22: Different programmes were held in Jammu and Delhi as part of the observation of Sankalp Divas to respect a resolution of the Indian Parliament passed on this day back in 1994, press statements read.

The 1994 resolution of the Indian Parliament said: "The State of Jammu and Kashmir has been, is, and shall remain an integral part of India and any attempts to separate it from the rest of the country will be resisted by all means".

PoJK Vishhapti Sewa Samiti organised various programmes beginning February 21 to observe the Sankalp Divas in Jammu.

A press statement said that a Sankalp Sabha was organised by Dr Deepak Kapoor, Chairman Shri Gita Mandir Simriti Bhawan, at Gita Mandir, Bakshi Nagar, Jammu on February 21 and a programme was organised by Arun Chowdhary (PoJK Vishhapti Sewa Samiti), at Master Devi Chand Municipal Park, Kotli Colony, Rehari Jammu, today.

Addressing the programme, Chowdhary said, "PoJK is an integral part of India and is our Motherland and we're determined to go back to our motherland."

Man shot dead by friend

JAMMU, Feb 22: A 28-year-old man was allegedly shot dead by his friend after the duo had a heated argument over a trivial issue on the Jammu outskirts, police said on Wednesday.

They said Arvind Jamwal died on the spot after being allegedly shot dead by Lakhan Partap Singh using his father's 12-bore gun at Gharota late on Tuesday night.

Quoting preliminary investigation, police said that the duo had a verbal argument over some petty issue during a marriage function on Tuesday. When Arvind Singh Jamwal returned to his home, he straightaway went to his friend's house on latter's call, where he was shot dead by Lakhan Partap Singh.

Police have arrested the accused from Nagrota area and booked him in case FIR number 21/2023 registered under sections 302 IPC and 3/25 Arms Act at Police Station Gharota.

The body of the deceased has also been handed over to his legal heirs after completing the medico-legal formalities.

Unattended packet triggers panic

Meanwhile, Jammu Kashmir People's Forum (JKPF), Delhi in collaboration with Mirpur Balidan Bhawan Samity, New Delhi, also observed this day as Sankalp Divas at the auditorium of Saraswati Bai Mandir, Rajouri Garden, New Delhi, on Wednesday.

As per a statement, the event was organised by various individuals and attended by displaced families from Mirpur, Bhimber, Kotli, Poonch and other areas now under the illegal occupation of Pakistan.

The speakers at the event emphasized that J&K, including the area illegally occupied by

Pakistan (PoJK), is an integral part of India and shall always remain so.

"Pakistan should immediately vacate the PoJK area," they said.

They further stated that any attempt to separate Jammu and Kashmir from rest of India shall be resisted by all means by the displaced persons, particularly Hindus and Sikhs from PoJK in 1947, are the real stakeholders of the area. "The Displaced persons had to leave behind all their movable and immovable properties and settle in Jammu and other parts of the country as they faced atrocities and violence in now PoJK," they said.

They said that post abrogation of Article 370, the DPs settled outside Jammu were also recognised as the citizens of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir as they have been granted Domicile Certificates by the J&K Government.

The event was presided over by Brij Lal, Rajya Sabha member and former DGP, Uttar Pradesh while Union MoS in PMO, Dr Jitendra Singh was the Chief Guest.

Body of youth fished out from Tawi

JAMMU, Feb 22: Police on Wednesday claimed that they have recovered the body of a 24-year-old youth from Tawi River.

SHO Nowabad Police Station, Inspector Vijay Kumar told Excelsior that from preliminary investigation, it appears that Rinku Kumar, a vegetable seller, accidentally fell into the river on February 17 near Jewel Chowk area.

Soon after receiving the information, he said, joint teams of police and SDRF started a rescue operation. "Today, a team of NDRF also joined the rescue operation. Owing to the collective efforts of the police, SDRF and NDRF, the body of the youth was finally fished out of the river after hectic efforts," said the police officer, adding that it was later handed over to the legal heirs of the deceased after completing the medico-legal formalities. "Further investigations are on," he said.

Colorectal cancer on rise in India

NEW DELHI, Feb 22:

Cancer of the large intestine, called colorectal cancer, is on the rise in India and although there has been a decline in the death rate, experts stress on early screening, especially of those aged 45 and above, and a healthy lifestyle to prevent fatalities.

Colorectal cancer is an umbrella term for colon, anus or rectum cancer. According to experts, while it is common to think that having a family history makes it difficult for one to keep cancer at bay, the disease is quite often lifestyle driven and even in hereditary cases, prevention and early diagnosis can improve outcomes.

"Cancer is being caused by multiple factors. Genes do play a role, but only 1-2 per cent cases are genetic. The rest are lifestyle driven. It takes just a faulty inner or outer environment to switch the bad genes on," Dr Vivek Mangla, a Gastro-intestinal, Hepato-Pancreatic-Biliary and Colorectal surgeon, said.

"As the saying goes prevention is better than cure, it is advisable that people seek preventive screening for colorectal cancer. Any person aged above 45 years should go for it," he added, more so if there is a family history of cancer. (PTI)

6 driving license, one route permit suspended

POONCH, Feb 22: On the recommendation of Police, ARTO Poonch, Basharat Hussain suspended six driving licenses and one route permit of the vehicle involved in bovine smuggling, rash driving, overloading and showing stunt on the road.

As per the information, continuing its drive against the bovine smugglers, Poonch Police besides registration of FIRs, detention of such criminals under PSA, has also taken a strict parallel action for cancellation of driving licenses, route permits of vehicles through concerned ARTOs for their involvement in bovine smuggling and other crime related to cruelty to animals.

Beside seizing the vehicles

involved in bovine smuggling, a detailed report regarding involvement of drivers/vehicles in bovine smuggling, rash driving, overloading were also prepared and sent to ARTO Poonch in respect of the cancellation of driving licenses of drivers and OI vehicle permit bearing registration number JK12-2725 for their involvement in the matter.

Consequently, on the initiative taken by Poonch Police, ARTO Poonch has suspended 6 licenses and permit of vehicle bearing registration Number JK12-2725, while in remaining cases, show cause notices have been given to drivers /vehicles owners on vehicle bearing number JK12-6573 for sheer violations contravention of provision of MVA rules and commissioning of offence of bovine smuggling.

Install CCTVs in police stations, probe agencies' offices

within a month: SC tells Centre, States

NEW DELHI, Feb 22:

The Supreme Court has directed the Centre and State Governments to comply with in a month with its directions on mandatory installation of CCTV cameras in police stations and offices of investigation agencies.

A bench headed by Justice BR Gavai asked the Governments to file their compliance affidavits till March 29, while warning in case of non-compliance, it will be compelled to take necessary steps against the officials concerned.

"If the directions are not complied with, we shall be compelled to take such steps as necessary against the Union home secretary and Chief Secretaries and Home Secretaries of respective State Governments," said the bench, also comprising Justices Vikram Nath and Sanjay Karol, on February 21.

The top had in 2020 directed installation of CCTV cameras and recording equipment at the offices of investigating agencies, including the Central Bureau of Investigation, the

Enforcement Directorate and National Investigation Agency, which conduct interrogations and have the power of arrest.

Senior advocate Siddhartha Dave, who has been appointed amicus curiae (friend of court) in the matter, submitted that 25 states and union territories were yet to file compliance reports in terms of the earlier directions which had initially set a deadline of six weeks for putting in place CCTVs in police stations across the country.

The Centre informed the court that CCTVs will be installed at the CBI headquarters here as well as its branch offices by the end of next month and that all offices of the Narcotics Control Bureau, Serious Frauds Investigation Office and Directorate of Revenue Intelligence have already complied with the directive.

It also said procurement of CCTVs for NIA establishments has been approved and the exercise will be concluding by the end of this year.

It sought time till May for installation of the remaining CCTVs at the Enforcement Directorate. As far as police

stations in Delhi are concerned, the Centre informed, there was a requirement of over 2,000 more CCTVs and currently 1,941 CCTVs needed to be upgraded.

In December 2020, a bench headed by Justice R F Nariman, while dealing with a matter related to custodial torture, had directed the Centre to install CCTV cameras and recording equipment at the offices of investigating agencies.

It had directed the states and union territories to ensure CCTV cameras are installed at each and every police station, at all entry and exit points, main gate, lock-ups, corridors, lobby and reception as also areas outside the lock-up rooms so that no part is left uncovered.

While passing the direction, the apex court had taken note of a 2017 case in which it had ordered installation of CCTV cameras in all the police stations to check human right abuses, videography of crime scene and setting up of a Central Oversight Committee. It had ordered setting up such a panel in every state and union territory. (PTI)
