LG hits out at NC, PDP on homes to homeless issue

Sinha said that they must understand that such discriminatory system was abolished on 5th August 2019. "Now we are marching ahead with one resolve and one aim that poorest of the poor, Dalits, OBCs and tribal community have the first right on Government resources, he added.

"As per Tribal Affairs Department, 40,000 PMAY houses to be allocated to eligible tribal community families. Government record suggests, out of these, around 8000 are landless. They cannot be deprived merely because some people do not want to see benefits reaching to underprivileged and tribals being empowered," he added.

The LG lauded the significant contribution of the Tribal community in strengthening the spirit of cultural integration and conservation and protection of natural resources.

"Tribal community has laid the strong foundation for the country to prosper. For centuries, the community acted as a bridge connecting our cultural ethos and conserving our biodiversity. Their determined contribution to the development process is a source of inspiration for all of us," he said.

Sinha also shared the efforts and initiatives of the Government to empower the tribal youth and women and to give impetus to the socio-economic development of the tribal community.

"We understand dreams of tribal youth and encouraging them every way possible so that they do not fall behind anyone in the age of accelerated change. Efforts are being made to ensure that every benefit is available to them," he said.

"Today the doors of opportunity are opening up for tribal community. It is the prime objective of the Government to provide equal opportunities to youth and women of tribal community, to ensure that

economic and social justice reaches them and we make them partners in the system," he added.

Sinha urged the people to buy the products made by the tribal community members. "We will also direct the Government departments to procure products made by Tribal artisans," he said.

He appreciated the artists of the tribal community from different States for showcasing the rich tribal culture and heritage through dance and music performances.

The LG launched various initiatives of Tribal Affairs Department including TRI Wool Web Portal and GIS Portal for Transhumance. He also rolled out Law 20 Coaching Scheme for Law students staying in Tribal Hostels.

Dr. Shahid Iqbal Choudhary, Secretary to the Government, Tribal Affairs Department gave a detailed briefing on the initiatives taken by the administration for the welfare of tribal community in J&K UT. He expressed gratitude to the Ministry of Tribal Affairs for the support.

The Tribal Affairs Department in collaboration with the Jodhpur-based Central Wool Development Board is launching several schemes for the families involved in sheep farming.

Under Law 20 Scheme, Law students staying in Tribal Hostels will be provided free of cost coaching for Prestigious Exams by the renowned coaching institute of the country.

The GIS Portal will help in tracking of the migratory tribal population.

Dr Naval Jit Kapoor, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Secretaries of various States; senior officers from Union Ministry, UT Administration and Police; members, artisans, entrepreneurs and students of tribal community were present on the occasion.

Cong to move SC on Rahul's conviction

Party (AAP) came out in support of Rahul Gandhi and accused the BJP of indulging in "unproductive politics" to divert people's attention from real issues.

The AAP and the Congress have been at loggerheads in the recent weeks over the services ordinance issue. The Congress has remained silent on its stand after Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal sought the opposition's support for his fight against the Centre's ordinance on services.

The BJP welcomed the verdict and said it is the Congress leader's "chronic habit" to abuse and defame others.

Referring to the cases Gandhi is facing, the High Court observed, "It is now the need of the hour to have purity in politics. Representatives of people should be men of clear antecedent."

"He (Gandhi) was trying to stay the conviction on absolutely non-existent grounds. It is a well-settled principle of law that staying of conviction is not a rule, but an exception, resorted to in rare cases. Disqualification is not only limited to MPs, MLAs. Moreover, as many as 10 criminal cases are pending against the applicant."

Justice Prachchhak pointed out that after the current complaint was filed, another complaint was submitted in a court in Pune by the grandson of Hindutva ideologue V D Savarkar for the Congress leader's "defamatory utterance against Veer Savarkar at Cambridge". Also, a separate complaint against him was filed in a Lucknow court.

In this backdrop, refusal of stay on conviction would not in any way result in injustice to the applicant, the judge said, adding, "the impugned order passed by the appellate court is just, proper and legal, and does not call for any interference."

While noting that there was no reasonable ground to stay the conviction at this stage, Justice Prachchhak also directed the district and sessions court of Surat to hear Gandhi's appeal against the conviction "as expeditiously as possible".

Referring to Gandhi's submission that the offence for which he was convicted was not serious, the judge noted his conviction is a "serious matter affecting a large segment of the society and needs to be viewed by this court with the gravity and significance it commands".

"The offence of Section 499 (dealing with defamation) can certainly be considered to be a serious offence of having a large public character thereby affecting the society at large in a given case wherein a large number of persons of the society have been defamed."

Countering Gandhi's submission that the offence was not seri-

ous, the court noted, "the accused was Member of Parliament, president of second largest national level political party and president of the party that ruled the country for more than 50 years, who was giving a public speech to the thousands of people and made a false statement in the election with clear intention to affect the result of the election."

"It appears that the accused suggested the name of the Prime Minister (Narendra Modi) to add sensation, apparently and for an intention to affect the result of the election of the candidate of the concerned constituency belonging to the political party of the Prime Minister."

"The accused did not stop there but imputed that 'saare choro ke naam modi hi kyu hai'. Thus, the present case would certainly fall within the category of seriousness of the offence," the court said.

Addressing a press conference at the AICC headquarters in Delhi, Congress spokesperson and Gandhi's counsel in the case Abhishek Singhvi said the verdict was "highly disappointing, but not unexpected".

The Government is finding "newer and newer techniques to throttle his voice...We are seeing this cycle of oppression and suppression play out once again. We will fight it. Rahul Gandhi will fight it. And if the last nine years are anything to go by, they will always fail to silence his vigilant voice," Singhvi said.

AICC general secretary Priyanka Gandhi Vadra said Rahul Gandhi is fighting the battle for truth and people's interests, and an "arrogant regime" is using all the tricks to deter him.

BJP leader and former Union Minister Ravi Shankar Prasad told reporters that law has caught up with Rahul Gandhi. The Congress leader refused to apologise for his 'Modi surname' jibe and displayed "irresponsible arrogance," he added.

A metropolitan magistrate's court in Surat on March 23 sentenced the former Congress president to two years in jail after convicting him under Indian Penal Code (IPC) Sections 499 and 500 (criminal defamation).

Following the verdict, Gandhi, elected to the Lok Sabha from Wayanad in Kerala in 2019, was disqualified as a Member of Parliament under the provisions of the Representation of the People Act.

Gandhi then challenged the order in a sessions court in Surat, which is still pending, along with an application seeking a stay to the conviction. While granting him bail, the sessions court on April 20 refused to stay the conviction, following which, he had knocked the doors of HC. (PTI)

Amarnath Ji pilgrimage temporarily halted on twin tracks due to bad weather

No one was hurt as the yatra was suspended this morning following heavy rains in the area, he said.

Most of the areas in the Kashmir valley received rain today.

According to Senior Superintendent of Police (Ramban) Mohita Sharma, the yatra has been halted in the district's Chanderkote area.

"The yatra has been suspended due to inclement weather in the Pahalgam belt," Sharma said.

Meanwhile, a fresh batch of over 7,000 pilgrims left the base camp here early this morning for the holy cave.

The pilgrims left the Bhagwati Nagar base camp here for the Valley in a convoy of 247 vehicles amid tight security.

Heavy showers as well as snow fall near holy cave which started early today, forced the temporary suspension of the pilgrimage, the officials said.

The pilgrims have been stopped at the Baital and the Nunwan base camps, officials added.

However, 2670 pilgrims which were near the holy cave area performed darshan despite heavy downpour and snowfall today.

With this, total number of pilgrims who paid obeisance at cave shrine during last seven days has touched 86,670.

As per reports the JK Police, CRPF and Army deployed at holy cave assisted the pilgrims in performing darshan as the track was slippery. Reports said besides, heavy rain snow also lashed the holy cave and yatra area during the day.

According to officials in Jammu, while a batch of 4,600 pilgrims on its way to the Pahalgam base camp has been stopped in Chanderkote, another group of 2,410 devotees travelling to the Baital camp have been allowed to proceed.

The yatra will resume once the weather improves, the officials said.

The officials said 4,600 pilgrims headed for Pahalgam left in a convoy of 153 vehicles, while another convoy of 94 vehicles carrying 2,410 pilgrims was the first to leave for the Baital base camp at 3.45 am.

With this, a total of 43,833 pilgrims have left the Jammu base camp for the Valley since June 30, the day the yatra started.

The 62-day annual pilgrimage to the 3,888-metre-high cave shrine in the South Kashmir Himalayas commenced from the twin tracks of Pahalgam in Anantnag district and Baital in Ganderbal district on July 1. The yatra is scheduled to conclude on August 31.

The entire yatra is being monitored from integrated command and control centre (ICCC). All departments monitor and send communication to their staff in field from here to cater to the requirements of pilgrims.

However, thousands of pilgrims are daily reaching Jammu from other parts of country for the pilgrimage of Shri Amarnath Ji. The yatri who reached here and those who returned after performing darshan have highly appreciated the Shri Amarnath Shrine Board and J&K administration for the yatra arrangements this year right from gateway of J&K, Lakhampur to the holy cave.

BJP appoints In-charges for poll-bound States

"All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) are coming up in Vijaypur and Awantipora, a number of National Highways, tunnels and road projects are being constructed and many of them are nearing completion and all-round development is taking place across the UT," Raina said.

On political front, Raina said the BJP is always ready to face Assembly elections whenever they are announced by the Election Commission of India and was focussing on all five Lok Sabha seats of Jammu and Kashmir in 2024 Parliamentary polls.

From the Union Territory of Ladakh, UT BJP chief Chunchok Stanzin attended the meeting and called for safeguards to the UT. He also demanded creation of two new districts—Nubra and Zaskar in Ladakh.

Stanzin also stressed for strengthening Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Councils (LAHDCs) of Leh and Kargil.

Nadda responded positively to all suggestions raised by Stanzin. Stanzin also gave presentation on the BJP's increasing strength in the Union Territory of Ladakh. Though the Leh Apex Body

(LAB) and Kargil Democratic Alliance (KDA) have been demanding Statehood and Sixth Schedule for Ladakh among others, the BJP has been calling for Statehood on the ground that UT was demand of Ladakh which has been fulfilled by Narendra Modi Government.

The meeting also comes ahead of Assembly elections in Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Telangana and Mizoram.

On Thursday, a similar meeting was held with leaders, mostly from eastern and north-eastern States, in Guwahati. BJP leaders from Southern States and Maharashtra will meet in Hyderabad on Sunday.

Sources said that "sewa, sushashan and garib kalyan (service, good governance, welfare of the poor)" has been the theme of the meetings with a focus on achievements and new initiatives of the Government.

The BJP has stepped up its organisational activities with the party ramping up its campaign to retain power at the Centre under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership.
