CEO sets process in motion for Municipal elections in J&K

The notice giving an abstract of the claims/objections received by the EROs shall be uploaded daily on website of the CEO and Deputy Commissioners of the concerned districts. The ERO shall pass an order on claims/objections latest by August 16 and every such order shall be put on notice board of the ERO immediately on such issuance," the CEO's order read.

It said any person aggrieved by the order passed by the ERO shall apply for revision before the ERO within prescribed statutory period of five days.

The order asked the Deputy Commissioners to organize special camps at the polling station levels.

Sources pointed out that term of Srinagar Municipal Corporation (SMC) will be complete on November 5 and that of Jammu Municipal Corporation (JMC) on November 14 while terms of rest all Municipal bodies including Councils and Committees in the UT will end between October-November.

The Army chief's visit comes amid continuing tensions along the India-China border.

He said in other States where Shias and Sunnis live in the same area, Muharram processions are not banned by the respective Governments there. The Governments in these States ensure that peace should prevail during the procession and they mean that. Even in Jammu we take the procession every year and members of other communities also extend their full cooperation, he added.

Court restrains company from heli service to Machail yatra

Aviation Pvt Ltd directing therein to restrain itself for carrying any kind of services for Machail yatra pilgrims on the land of landowner.

The landowner in his plea contended that the Heli-company including the officials are forcibly trying to make use of his land for helpaid without his consent and without paying any due in the shape of rent for annual Machail yatra.

The court after hearing the matter was convinced that the counsel for the landowner has carved out a case for preserving and protecting his rights. Court said that apart from the service-company, the State functionaries are also bent upon occupying the proprietary land of the plaintiff-applicant without providing him any kind of compensation.

"The state cannot choose between the land owner and service provider running profitable business for the company while denying the basic rights of the landowner. Therefore, the non-applicants are temporarily restrained from carrying on any kind of service into the

Railway Station. The bridge over Tarnah river on Jammu-Pathankot National Highway, near Dayalchak/ Chadval suffered damages due to flash flood on July 19.

"In view of the inconvenience caused to road traffic on account of the damage to Tarnah bridge on NH in district Kathua, a request was made to the Railway Ministry to issue instructions for the stoppage of 'Jammu Mail' train No. 14033/14034 at Railway Station 'Chhan Rorian' of district Kathua in J&K," Dr Singh tweeted.

In a letter addressed to Ashwini Vaishnav, Dr Singh has requested that it may be addressed urgently in view of the fact that alternative road in the area has got suddenly disrupted because of the collapse of road bridge over Tarnah on Jammu-Pathankote National Highway to the current flash floods.

"Since the people of the region are facing gross inconvenience, the decision to order Railway to stop at Chhan Rorian, even though temporarily for the time being, will go a long way in mitigating their sufferings till the damaged road bridge is restored," Dr Singh said in the letter.

"May I also mention here for your kind reference that the Jammu Mail stop at this same station of 'Chhan Rorian' existed earlier also before the onset of COVID pandemic," Dr Singh added.

Meanwhile, Northern Railway authorities today confirmed that Jammu Mail will now stop at Chhan Rorian Station for one minute, at 18.06 hrs while coming from Jammu side of Delhi and at 5.25 hrs while on way from Delhi towards Jammu and Katra.

Over 7000 pay obeisance at holy cave, 3.77 lakh in 28 days

President will be Visitor to IIMs with power to appoint, remove directors

NEW DELHI, July 28:

The President will be Visitor to the Indian Institutes of Management (IIMs) with powers to audit their functioning, order probes and appoint as well as remove directors, according to a bill introduced in Lok Sabha on Friday to amend the IIM Act of 2017. The bill was introduced amid disruptions by opposition members over the violence in Manipur.

According to the Indian Institutes of Management (Amendment) Bill, 2023, the President of India shall be Visitor of every institute. "The Visitor may appoint one or more persons to review the work and progress of any institute, to hold enquiries into affairs thereof and to report in such manner as the Visitor may direct. (PTI)
