3 militants captured along with Afghan made cooker IED

to prepare dinner. Considering capacity of cookers, the militants put about 10 kg of explosives material in it to cause maximum damage in case of explosion, the officials said.

The militants revealed that they had planned to plant the IED at Gulpur Bridge in Poonch to target Army convoys

Arrested militants have been identified as Mohammad Riyaz, 23, son of Mohammad Feroq, Mohammad Feroq, 26 son of Mohammad Rafi and Mohammad Zubair, 22, son of Mohammad Razaq, all residents of Karmara.

Mohammad Rafiq was hit with a bullet in his left foot and has been admitted in the hospital where his condition was stated to be stable. Injured soldier has also been hospitalized and he too is responding to the treatment.

Recoveries made from their possession include a powerful 10 kg IED concealed in a pressure cooker like device, one AK-56 rifle with one magazine and 10 bullets (rest of the bullets had been fired by the militant), two pistols with four magazines and 70 rounds, six Chinese hand grenades and 20 packets of narcotics.

Officials confirmed that this was a rare occasion when all three militants were captured alive by the Army after an encounter and said their questioning will lead to vital clues including source of weapons and narcotics in Pakistan and PoJK and their likely targets in the twin border districts of

Poonch and Rajouri. Excepting injured, two other militants have been shifted for sustained questioning. As per the officials, all three militants were residents of village Karmara Polas which is located ahead of the border fencing on the LoC in Poonch sector from where they appeared to have been lured into militancy by PoJK-based militant commanders.

"Recovery of 10 kg IED has averted what could have been a major catastrophe," the officials said. "The area where encounter took place has been cordoned and search operation is in progress. Blood trails have been found. Three terrorists with some weapons, war-like stores including one IED and narcotics have been apprehended. One Indian Army soldier was injured in the ensuing firing and has been evacuated," Defence spokesperson Lt Col Devender Anand said.

The militants are believed to have received the arms and narcotic consignment from across the border and were trying to smuggle it into this side when they were intercepted by the troops, the officials said. The IED was later neutralised by the experts of the Bomb Disposal Squad, the officials said. The search operation in the area was still going on when last reports were received, the officials said.

Army has been maintaining a very high alert all along the LoC in twin border districts of Rajouri and Poonch to thwart infiltration attempts by the militants from Pakistan side.

DDC member booked, denies allegations

Aijaz is accused of wrongful restraint and voluntarily causing hurt, following a complaint filed by Nazim Hussain Bhat and Imdad Ali Mir. "On the basis of the complaint lodged by Nazim Hussain Bhat and Imdad Ali Mir, FIR No. 51/2023 u/s 323,341 of the IPC dated May 30, 2023, was registered in Panthachowk police station against DDC member Aijaz Hussain Rather on offenses of wrongful restraint and voluntarily causing hurt," the Srinagar Police said on Twitter.

Rather, besides being a DDC member, also serves as a member of the Haj Committee of India. He previously held the position of National Vice President in the Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha (BJYM), the youth wing of the BJP. In the 2020 DDC elections, Rather emerged victorious from Srinagar's Khonmoh seat, one of the three seats the party secured in the Kashmir valley.

A video went viral on Tuesday evening, capturing an incident where several individuals alleged that Aijaz Hussain Rather, along with his Personal Security Officer (PSO), had assaulted them while they were on their way home to Balhama, located on the outskirts of Srinagar.

Responding to the allegations, Rather called a press conference at his office in Pathanchowk, Srinagar, where he vehemently denied the charges. He claimed that the individuals who accused him were part of a land mafia group that he had actively worked against.

"The entire Balhama community is exhausted and frustrated with the repeated disruptive actions of these individuals. They have been involved in illegal activities

such as attempts to seize Pandit properties and agricultural land, as well as the misuse of state-owned land. It is clear that their frustration stems from the Government's efforts to address these unlawful actions," he stated.

During the press conference, Aijaz provided his account of the events, explaining that he received a call around 9:30 p.m. the previous day about a viral video involving members of the alleged land mafia group. He described how he conducted a visit to the Khonmoh block in Khonmoh with the Secretary of the Rural Development Department.

Following the visit, he proceeded to Balhama, where he was confronted with a barrage of verbal abuse, threats, and derogatory remarks. "I calmly left the scene and promptly reported the incident to the Panthachowk Police Station, where I filed a formal complaint against the individuals involved," he said.

Surprisingly, Rather claimed that the Mayor of Srinagar has openly shown support for these individuals, raising concerns about his involvement with the alleged land mafia. He called upon the Government to expose and take action against the land mafia, "all four individuals had already been issued notices as they were allegedly linked to the illegal acquisition of approximately 50 plots of land," he said.

Rather emphasized that as a responsible citizen, it is his duty to combat any illegal activities within his jurisdiction. He assured the public of his faith in the judiciary and the police, affirming his commitment to preserving his own and his party's reputations.

Rains lash J&K, MeT predicts wet weather for few more days

Jammu-Srinagar National Highway since 9 AM today but in the evening, the traffic was restored. However, there was a traffic jam like situation there due to waterlogging.

Heavy rains also triggered a major landslide on Mughal road near Ratta Chambi bridge, blocking traffic movement. The men and machines were on job to clear the landslide when the last reports came in.

Jammu recorded 11.4 mm of overnight rainfall, Srinagar 5.7 mm, Qazigund 13.6 mm, Katra 17.4 mm, Bhaderwah 10.6 mm, Pahalgam 11.6 mm, Gulmarg 9.8 mm, Kukumarg 13 mm and Kupwara 2.7 mm.

Meanwhile, due to continuous rainfall across the Union Territory, temperature dropped by several notches. Srinagar recorded a low of 11.6°C against 11.8°C on the previous night and it was below normal by 0.9°C for city, Qazigund, recorded a low of 10.2°C against

11.2°C on the previous night and it was above normal by 0.9°C for the town.

Pahalgam recorded a low of 7.8°C against 8.8°C on the previous night and it was 1.2°C above normal for the tourist resort while in Kupwara town, the mercury settled at 11.2°C, the same as on the previous night and it was 0.2°C above normal for the town. Kokernag recorded a low of 9.1°C against 8.3°C on the previous night and it was 2.0°C below normal for the place. Gulmarg recorded a low of 5.0°C against 4.0°C on previous night and it was below normal by 2.6°C for the skiing resort.

Jammu recorded a low of 18.0 degree Celsius, Banihal 10.5, Batote 11.7, Katra 16.1 and Bhaderwah recorded 10.8 degree Celsius.

The Meteorological Department has forecast widespread intermittent light to moderate rain, thunder and lightning with possibility of hailstorm and gusty winds at few places till Friday.

Bhuttavi, who founded LeT headquarters in Muridke in Punjab, was deputy to the outlawed Jamaat-ud-Dawa (JuD) chief and Mumbai attack mastermind Hafiz Saeed. The JuD is the front organisation for the LeT.

"Bhuttavi, 77, was incarcerated at District Jail Sheikhpura, some 60 kms from Lahore, since October 2019 in a terror financing case. On May 29, he felt severe pain in his chest and was shifted to hospital where he was pronounced dead (due to cardiac arrest) on arrival," a JuD official told PTI.

His funeral was held at the LeT/JuD headquarters in Muridke in which a large number of the supporters of the banned organisation participated amid high security.

A source in the Punjab government told PTI that JuD chief Hafiz Saeed, who is lodged at the Kot Lakhpat jail since 2019 serving multiple sentences in terror financing cases, had requested the government to

allow him to attend Bhuttavi's funeral but permission was not granted.

An Anti-Terrorism Court in Lahore had given Bhuttavi a jail term of 16 years in a terror financing case in 2020.

A close aide to Saeed, Bhuttavi faced sanctions from the US treasury department in 2011.

The UN Security Council's ISIL (Daesh) and Al Qaeda Sanctions Committee added Bhuttavi to its list of designated terrorists in March 2012.

Bhuttavi was designated a terrorist by the UN Security Council for "participating in the financing, planning, facilitating, preparing, or perpetrating of acts or activities by, in conjunction with, under the name of, on behalf of, or in support of" or "otherwise supporting acts and activities of" LeT.

A summary by the UN committee described him as a founding member of LeT who served as the acting emir of the LeT and the JuD on at least two occasions when Saeed was detained. (PTI)

"Investigations have further revealed that Pak-based operatives are using drones to deliver arms/ammunitions, explosives, narcotics etc. to their operatives and cadres in the Kashmir valley. These operatives are using the social media to connect with the cadres and workers in India," read the statement.

"They think they can explain history to historians, science to scientists and warfare to the army. But at the core of it is mediocrity. They're not ready to listen!" he said.

India, China hold talks on Ladakh

sides agreed to hold 19th round of high-level military talks at an early date to achieve the objective of restoration of peace and tranquillity in the border areas.

The meeting took place under the framework of Working Mechanism for Consultation and Coordination on India-China Border Affairs (WMCC).

The Indian and Chinese troops are locked in an over three-year confrontation in certain friction points in eastern Ladakh even as the two sides completed disengagement from several areas following extensive diplomatic and military talks.

"The two sides reviewed the situation along the LAC in Western Sector of India-China border areas and discussed proposals for disengagement in remaining areas in a frank and open manner," it said.

"Restoration of peace and tranquillity will create condi-

tions for normalising bilateral relations," the MEA said.

"In order to achieve this objective, in accordance with existing bilateral agreements and protocols, they agreed to hold the next (19th) round of Senior Commander's meeting at an early date," it said in a statement.

The MEA said the two sides agreed to continue discussions through military and diplomatic channels.

It was the 27th meeting of the WMCC. The previous WMCC meeting was held in Beijing on February 22.

The Joint Secretary (East Asia) of the Ministry of External Affairs led the Indian delegation.

The Chinese side was led by the Director General of the Boundary and Oceanic Affairs Department of the Chinese Ministry of Foreign Affairs. (PTI)

Growth may exceed 6.5 pc estimate: CEA

performance.

The real GDP growth for 2022-23 is higher compared to the growth projections by various international agencies, reflecting the strong resilience of the Indian economy.

India's economy grew by 6.1 per cent in the January-March quarter of 2022-23, pushing the annual growth rate to 7.2 per cent on account of better performance by agriculture, manufacturing, mining and construction sectors.

India was the fastest-growing major economy over the last fiscal and in the quarter ending March 2023 as well, he said, adding, growth in the year was driven by robust private consumption and a sustained increase in capital formation.

Briefing media on the quarterly numbers, Nageswaran said, the risk to the projected 6.5 per cent GDP number is evenly balanced and there is a good chance of this number may be exceeded in the current fiscal.

In the latest monthly economic report released in the third week of May, he said, "We did say that, while in the economic survey, we mentioned that 6.5 per cent was our target or an estimate of the real GDP growth for this financial year but we also mentioned that the risks to the downside were higher.

and say that the risks to 6.5 per cent are probably more evenly balanced. There is as good a chance that this number may be exceeded as there is a chance that reality may undershoot this number. So, we are prepared to say that the risks are more evenly balanced than what we felt four months ago."

High frequency indicators for industry, services, external sector, fiscal and credit growth are all pointing to sustain momentum in the economy, he said, adding, growth prospects, therefore, appear bright.

External factors as per the RBI's Annual Report pose downside risks because of the geopolitics situation, oil production and potential for further monetary tightening in some developed countries and with that the attendant risks of further financial stress.

He also said that private sector capital formation is beginning to unfold as indicated by the March financial number of the corporate sector.

Gross Fixed Capital Formation (GFCF) has been a major growth driver in Q4 of 2022-23, with its share in GDP (at 2011-12 prices) being at 10-year high of 35.3 per cent in Q4 of 2022-23, as crowding-in of private sector investment by public sector investment picks up pace. (PTI)
