**PP rolls out drone emergency response system**

agencies in Punjab. They said that hardly a day passes when drone movement is not spotted in border districts of Punjab even though the Border Security Force has gunned down many unmanned aerial vehicles and seized packets of heroin in the recent past.

In the past few weeks, the border guarding force shot down several drones in Punjab, which shares 553-km border with Pakistan.

Last week, Punjab Governor Banwarilal Purohit targeted Pakistan for pushing drugs into India and said that surgical strikes should be conducted against the neighbouring nation to teach it a lesson.

During his two-day visit to border districts, Purohit also commended the Punjab Police and district administrations for making a lot of efforts for drug seizure, border security and tackling the issue of drones.

Pathankot Senior Superintendent of Police Harkamal Preet Singh Khakhsaid the drone emergency response system (DERS) is being implemented on a pilot basis in Pathankot and it will be replicated in other border districts of the State.

DERS has been implemented in Pathankot's 14 villages which are within two kilometers of the International Border.

He said two village police officers have been deployed in each of the 14 villages. The village police officers (VPOs) are local residents and will work in tandem with village-level defence committees (VLDs) to keep a check on any suspicious movement in their villages.

Whenever any drone movement is noticed in a village, the VPO will activate the VLD and will also inform the police control room, he said.

Till the time a police team reaches the spot, the VPO along with the VLD will cordon off the area where any contraband or weapon has been dropped off by a Pakistani drone to prevent its retrieval by any miscreant or smuggler, the police said.

The initial response will be trig-

gered without any delay, followed by a secondary response within a span of five to 10 minutes, and a tertiary response within 15 to 20 minutes, resulting in the swift apprehension of individuals involved in unlawful activity, the police said.

VLDs have been set up in border districts of Punjab to keep a check on suspicious movement.

Gurdaspur Deputy Commissioner Himanshu Aggarwal said VLDs comprising 11 members each have been set up in 265 villages which are located within 15 km of the international border.

VLD members are mainly village heads, ex-servicemen or influential persons and if they see any suspicious activity, they inform the authority concerned, Aggarwal said.

WhatsApp groups of VLDs have been formed to share information and a joint command and control centre has been set up in the deputy commissioner's office.

"We are motivating them (VLD members) to be the defenders of their villages," Aggarwal said.

The Gurdaspur district administration was praised by the Punjab Governor for setting up VLDs in villages up to 15 km from the international border.

"Ninety-four cameras have been installed across the district, especially in the border areas, and the live feed of these cameras is jointly monitored by police and civil officials," the deputy commissioner said.

He said 30 panchayats in Gurdaspur have already passed resolutions that they will not allow any drug activity in their villages and will make their villages completely drug-free in the next six months.

Last month, the Punjab Police had declared a reward of Rs 1 lakh on information of drone movement leading to the recovery of weapons and narcotics.

The State Government has sanctioned Rs 20 crore for installation of CCTV cameras at strategic locations in the border villages to keep a strict vigil on the movement of drones and cross-border smugglers. (PTI)

**J&K struggles with drastic reductions in ration**

**2004 quintals in rice supply to the region.**

The data revealed a clear downward trajectory in rice allocation, with the most recent allocation recorded at 2496 quintals in March 2023. Comparatively, this represents a stark reduction from the initial allocation of 4500 quintals in June 2019. The decline continued steadily, hitting a low point of 2190 quintals in July 2022.

An official at the CAPD department shed light on the reasons behind the decline in food grain allocation. Previously, he said, Jammu and Kashmir's residents received rice through two schemes: the National Food Security Act and the Jammu and Food Entitlement Scheme.

"These schemes provided 10 kilograms of food per person. Additionally, the Government distributed a free ration of extra 5 kilograms under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY) program from the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic until January of last year," he said.

**Abdul Sattar, Director of Consumer Affairs and Public Distribution, expressed his commitment to addressing the issue. "I will take the matter up with the concerned authorities and work towards finding a resolution," he said.**

**IndiGo flight enters Pak**

flight landed in Ahmedabad safely post the deviation," it added.

Earlier, Dawn newspaper reported that the IndiGo plane with a ground speed of 454 knots entered north of Lahore at about 7:30 pm on Saturday and returned to India at 8:01 pm.

Citing a senior official of Pakistan's Civil Aviation Authority (CAA), the paper said that it was not unusual as it was "internationally allowed" in bad weather conditions.

In May, a Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) flight entered Indian airspace and stayed there for nearly 10 minutes due to heavy rainfall in Pakistan.

The flight, PK248, was returning from Muscat on May 4 and was attempting to land at the Allama Iqbal International Airport in Lahore. However, heavy rainfall made it difficult for the pilot to land the Boeing 777 aircraft.

Meanwhile, several flights were diverted and delayed in Pakistan due to poor visibility at airports. The CAA spokesman said that it had extended the weather warning for Lahore till 11:30 pm on Saturday as the visibility at the Allama Iqbal International Airport was 5,000 metres.

A number of flights heading to Lahore were diverted to Islamabad due to poor visibility. Rain accompanied by strong winds and thunder lashed parts of Pakistan on Saturday evening. The worst hit areas were three adjoining districts of Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa province where about 29 people were killed, according to local media. (PTI)

terrorist fighters are projecting threat across Afghanistan's borders and that the operations of ISIL-K are becoming more sophisticated and lethal (if not more numerous), it said.

The report added that the Taliban harbouring and supporting TTP evidences a threat projecting beyond the borders of Afghanistan and negates the group's numerous assertions that Afghanistan's soil will not be used for carrying out attacks against other countries.

"The relationship between the Afghan Taliban and TTP, like the Taliban's relationship with Al-Qaeda, is tightly bonded and unlikely to dissipate," the report said adding that there is an ideological anomaly in the nature of the historical dynamic between TTP and ISIL-K, now the main threat to the Taliban within Afghanistan borders.

"Continued Taliban support to TTP seems likely to test Pakistan's powers of restraint and risks a return to increased levels of violence on both sides of the border," it said.

The present Monitoring Team report, the first in which the Taliban have been in power for the entirety of the reporting period, finds that the Taliban leadership shows no signs of bending to pressure for reform or compromise, in the hope of earning international

Furthermore, he added, it will serve as a vibrant venue for cultural events and conversations, fostering a rich exchange of ideas.

"We can see a lot of changes here now. Tourism is increasing, projects are going on, people will get employment. This was not seen before. But, today, there is development, that is what people want," he said.

This is a paradise and tourists come here not only from various corners of the country but also from across the world, he added.

Responding to a question on political parties demand for conduct of Assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir, Shinde said the Prime Minister will definitely take a decision on it.

He said the BJP will win the Lok Sabha elections next year with a thumping majority and all previous poll records will be broken under the leadership of Narendra Modi.

"...In the coming elections, all records of the Lok Sabha elections will be broken under the leadership of PM Modi and BJP will win the Lok Sabha polls with a thumping majority," Shinde said.

He took a swipe at the opposition parties which are set to meet on June 23 in Patna to chalk out a joint strategy against the BJP.

"If we talk about the 2024 polls, many parties are getting together against Modi, but they have not been able to name a person who can be their candidate. This had happened in 2014 polls as well, but Modi got a clear majority."

"In 2019 as well, parties came together, but what happened? Modi got a thumping majority. Now again, they are getting together... But Modi will again get a thumping majority," he said.

"Modi does not respond to criticism, but works for the people. He does not give importance to his critics," Shinde added.

He said his party will use its strength to help the BJP retain power under Modi's leadership.

He said the amount of work done in the last nine years has surpassed what was done in 40-50 years before that.

"The elections will take place on the issue of development. So many roads and airports have been

Q: A number of Banks are facing problems on account of NPA. Has J&K Bank made any improvement on this front?

A: Let me tell you that recovery in NPAs has been a very tough and challenging task for the Banks but due to efficient monitoring, proper follow-up and robust recovery mechanism, we were able to achieve asset quality figures that are the best ones in the last eight years.

Since strengthening the balance Sheet remained our priority, therefore, NPA reduction was one of means to achieve it. During the FY 2022-23, our gross NPAs improved remarkably to 6.04% as against 8.67% recorded a year earlier while as the net NPA figure reached 1.62% from 2.49%. The focus on further improving on the asset quality front and recovery of bad loans shall continue unabated.

Q: There have been some reports that Jammu and Kashmir Bank suffered huge financial loss due to escape of Vijay Malaya and Nirav Modi. If yes, to what extent it has impacted the Bank?

A: Since we are the custodians of public trust, we always take care of our lending and ensure that it is secured by employing all the requisite regulatory provisions. Coming to your question regarding Nirav Modi, let me tell you that we have not given any loan to him.

Further, we had taken some exposure with the Kingfisher Airlines (Company promoted by Vijay Malaya) but the major portion of the granted loan has already been recovered from the sale of the underlying security i.e. shares of United Breweries (UB) and the outstanding exposure to the company is well below Rs. 20 crore which is fully provided for.
