Performance not up to mark in several districts of Jammu

As per the physical status as on January 31, 2023, only 30% progress has been made in respect of Gurdwara Sundar Singh Jammu while as work has yet not been started for repair/renovation of Jaffer Chak Masjid and Sumah Temple at Akhnour respectively.

In Ramban district, only 10% progress has been made on restoration of Ghoda Gali at Gool while as progress has remained dismal in respect of all the four sites in Reasi, two sites in Samba and four sites in Udhampur district.

The sites which have been selected for restoration in Reasi district are Salal Fort at Beatal Gala, Barood Khana near Salal Fort, Bhim Garh Fort and bathing ghat at Dera Baba Ji Shrine. The heritage sites being funded for restoration in Samba district are Bamuchak Temple and Mahoregarh Fort while as in Udhampur district such sites are Krimchi Fort, Jagaru Fort, Charai Muttal and Ladden Kotli Fort.

Kathua is the only district where significant progress has been made in the restoration of selected heritage sites and this can be gauged from the fact that 50% work has been completed on Jaggannath Temple near Jasrota Fort and Jamergerh Fort at Jandi in Hiranagar tehsil. The work on other two sites namely Thein Fort and Hanuman Temple near Jasrota Fort has also picked up the pace.

Official sources told EXCELSIOR that Secretary, Culture Department, Dr Syed Abid Rasheed Shah, in a recent meeting with concerned officers, expressed displeasure over dismal performance in the implementation of scheme in most of the districts of Jammu province.

"He explicitly told the executing agency to ensure that pace of work is geared up on all the sites as early as possible so that objectives behind the scheme are achieved within the fixed timeline", sources informed, adding "since the weather has improved in almost all the districts of Jammu province the Secretary wants expeditious execution of repair and restoration works".

Sources further said, "the concerned Deputy Commissioners should regularly review progress in the implementation of scheme as funds have been released to them by the Directorate of Archives, Archeology and Museums", adding "moreover, the executing agency should complete the procedural formalities as early as possible so that men and material are mobilized for early start of work".

Not only the super structure of the identified heritage sites need restoration, landscaping, water and power connections and construction of toilet complexes are the other works which are required to be carried out as such the scheme can be implemented only with the proper coordination of all the concerned agencies, sources said.

jointness displayed by the troops in all dimensions of counter-terror operations has nullified/limited the kinetic threat" Lt Gen Dwivedi said.

Referring to the situation along the Line of Control (LoC) with Pakistan, the Army Commander said LoC remained stable and the ceasefire understanding continues to sustain.

However, he added, a very strict vigil and a robust technology enabled multi-tiered counter infiltration grid is being maintained, to thwart any attempts aimed at infiltration of militants.

"Ceasefire violations, infiltration bids or any other misadventure attempted by the adversary will be dealt with firmly," he declared.

Regarding situation along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) with China in Eastern Ladakh, Lt Gen Dwivedi said: "We are ever-ready to respond to any attempt to unilaterally change the status quo. Progressive initiatives for tri-services and inter-agency cooperation to include ITBP and BSF and other CAPFs have borne desired results. Coordinated training, exercises and operational tasks are being undertaken by all stakeholders to streamline procedures and enhance our ability to robustly defend our borders". At the same time, he said, the measures to resolve the LAC situation at diplomatic and operational levels are also simultaneously underway.

However, he warned, any adverse aggressive designs or attempts will definitely be met with appropriate posturing of troops and a strong intent.

"The areas of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh under Northern Command, are very important for India from the geographical and strategic point of view. The unique operational situation of Northern Command along our borders warrants undivided attention to operational preparedness in order to guard the L/C/LAC/AGPL, while keeping the hinterland safe and thus Northern Command is always in combat," the Army Commander

NIA court issues warrants against 13 militants

killing of Kashmiri Pandit Sanjay Sharma, who worked as a bank guard.

"In yesterday's (Tuesday's) encounter, we used a Critical Situation Response Vehicle (CSRV) that is bullet proof and it can be used for room intervention or to engage the enemy which is holed up inside a house. It has very little turning radius. It's bulletproof and can be used to ram the walls. We also have bullet-proof JCBs that are similar in purpose," IG CRPF (Kashmir Operations) M S Bhatia said.

The CSRV and the JCBs have a bullet-proof cabin mounted on a forklift for security personnel to gain advantage of height against the adversary without being exposed to danger.

The CSRV cabin provides 180-degree protection while the JCBs have 360-degree protection for the soldiers inside the bullet-proof cabin.

Bhatia said drones were also being used by the force and they have played a vital role in counter-insurgency operations in the Valley.

"Drones are something which is increasingly used by us for the surveillance of National Highways during the movement of our convoys. The drones are used extensively during the Amarnath Yatra also. We also use drones in developing encounter situations in operational scenarios, to see where the enemy is hiding or whether he has been neutralised or not," he added.

Wall-through radars (WTR) and hand-held thermal imagers (HHTI) are the other gadgets that have reduced the risk for jawans

in complex operations. "HHTI are also used. We have them in every battalion especially in south Kashmir which is more affected as far as terrorism is concerned. They are also acting as force multipliers while approaching jungles and hideouts. While shooting in the dark, it helps to know exact focus," he added.

Bhatia said the CRPF has used technology in the valley like CCTV surveillance along the entire national highway after the Pulwama terrorist attack in 2019.

"We have set up 14 nakas on NH, all are equipped with CCTV cameras and footage is examined and analysed round-the-clock by officers," he said.

Bhatia said the bullet proofing of the vehicles used by CRPF has been taken up in a big way.

"We have launched bullet-proof vehicles on a large scale. Some of them are done in factories while some are locally fabricated. We have introduced mine-proof vehicles and medium bullet-proof vehicles in the Valley. They are also acting like multipliers so that our jawans feel secure," he said.

Asked if MP-5 rifles were used by the force in the valley, Bhatia replied in the affirmative.

"We have procured MP-5 rifles but there is use of certain weapons in certain scenarios. So MP-5 weapons are definitely there in the Valley with us but used only depending on the situation. We use our telescopic guns also but the general stock of weapons we use in the Valley is AK-47," he added. (PTI)

CEC, ECs to be appointed on advise of PM, LoP, CJI Panel: SC

President may from time to time fix and their appointments shall, subject to the provisions of any law made in that behalf by parliament, be made by the President.

The Apex Court had reserved its judgement on the issue on November 24 last year. During the hearing in the matter, the top court had questioned the "haste" and "tearing hurry" with which the Centre had appointed ex-bureaucrat Arun Goel as an Election Commissioner, saying his file travelled at "lightning speed" within departments in 24 hours.

The Central Government had vehemently resisted the observations, with Attorney General R Venkataramani contending that the whole issue pertaining to his appointment needed to be looked at in entirety.

The Apex Court had asked how the Union Law Minister shortlisted a panel of four names that was recommended to the Prime Minister for appointment as Election Commissioner when none of them would have completed the stipulated six-year tenure in office.

It had perused the Centre's original file on Goel's appointment, and said, "What kind of evaluation is this? Although, we are not questioning the merits of Arun Goel's credentials but the process."

As the bench questioned the "lightning speed" with which Goel was appointed as an EC, Venkataramani, the Government's law officer, had urged the bench not to make observations without looking into the entire issue of the appointment process.

Under the Election Commission (Conditions of Service of Election Commissioners and Transaction of Business) Act, 1991, an EC can have a tenure of six years or up to the age of 65, whichever is earlier.

On November 19, Goel, a Punjab cadre IAS officer, was appointed as Election Commissioner.

Goel would be in line to be the next CEC after incumbent Rajiv Kumar demits office in February 2025. His total tenure in the Election Commission would be of over five years.

There was a vacancy in the Election Commission (EC) following the retirement of previous CEC Sushil Chandra in May.

Goel was the Secretary in the Ministry of Heavy Industries and his voluntary retirement came into effect on November 18 last year. He has also served in the Union Culture Ministry. (PTI)

Chandrachud then got agitated and said, "Don't threaten the chief justice. Is this a way to behave? Please sit down. It will not be listed like this. Please leave my court. I will not list like this. I will not be covered down by you."

"Vikas Singh, please don't raise your voice. As a president, you should be mentor and leader to the Bar. I am sorry, you are reducing the level of dialogue. You have filed an Article 32 petition, claiming that the land allotted to the Supreme Court should be handed over to the Bar for construction of chambers. We will deal with the matter when it comes. Please don't try and twist our arm to give you the relief you want," the CJI said.

"You are asking for a land allotted to the SC to be given to the Bar. I have announced my decision. It will be taken on 17th and it will not be first on board," he added.

"I'm sorry for what happened this morning. I apologise. There is a Lakshman Rekha that none of us should cross. I don't think that the bar should transgress the limits of decorum."

The CJI said, "There is no reason to behave like this. We sit here the whole day and take up 70-80 matters in a day. For all these matters, I sit with my staff in the evening and give them dates."

Senior advocate Neeraj Kishan Kaul also expressed apology and said, "We all join and feel equally anguished by what happened." (PTI)
