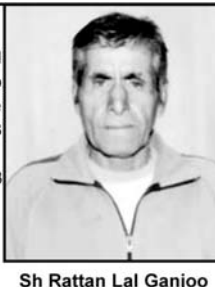

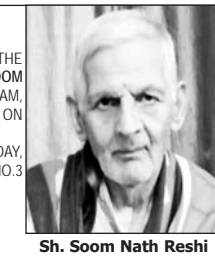

"The Prime Minister's mantra of 'Vanchito ko Variyata' is guiding our developmental journey. In the last 30 months, we have ensured governance is inclusive, transparent, effective and accountable, and provides equal benefit and equal opportunity to all," he added.

The Lt Governor urged the talented youth to avail the benefits of youth-oriented programmes run by the Government. "Mission youth will extend benefits of all 17 schemes. Sports Council will provide opportunities and all possible help to the promising players in various sports disciplines, he added.

Dr Deepak Kapoor, president, PoJK Visthapit Seva Samiti expressed his gratitude towards the Government for making dedicated efforts for the welfare of the PoJK Displaced persons.

Ramesh Kumar, Divisional Commissioner, Jammu; KK Sidha, Commissioner, Relief & Rehabilitation and other senior officers were also present.

Underlining the importance of a strong health infrastructure for the treatment of serious ailments, he said more than 1.5 lakh health centres are being developed in close proximity of residential areas. Facilities for screening serious ailments like diabetes, cancer and heart-related issues will also be available at these centres.

The prime minister said critical health infrastructure is being made accessible in small towns and villages under the PM-Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission which is not only giving rise to new hospitals but it is also creating a new and complete health ecosystem.

As a result, Modi noted that many opportunities are being created for health entrepreneurs, investors and professionals.

On human resources in the sector, he said more than 260 new medical colleges have been opened in the last few years, doubling the medical seats in graduate and post-graduate medical courses as compared to 2014.

The prime minister also spoke about the emphasis on the nursing field in this year's budget.

"Opening 157 nursing colleges in the vicinity of medical colleges is a huge step in the direction of medical human resources. This may be useful in fulfilling global demand, not just the domestic need", he added.

Modi also highlighted the role of technology in constantly making medical services accessible and affordable and elaborated on the government's focus on implementation of technology in the sector.

"We want to give timely healthcare to citizens through the facility of Digital Health ID. Ten crore people have already benefited by teleconsultation through schemes like e-Sanjivini", he said, adding 5G is creating new opportunities in this sector for startups while drones are bringing revolutionary changes in medicine delivery and testing services.

While noting the impact of the Government's efforts on preventive healthcare, he listed Swachh Bharat Abhiyan for cleanliness, Ujjwala Scheme for smoke-related diseases, Jal Jeevan Mission to tackle waterborne diseases and National POSHAN Mission is addressing anaemia and malnutrition. He also highlighted the role of millets in the International Year of Millets.

bomb attack in Bolan, Notezai said. Another police official said the militants might have tried to target the Sibi festival which is held annually but might not have succeeded in piercing the heavy security cover. "So instead they targeted these men who were returning to Quetta," he added.

According to the official, the motorcycle - believed to be a suicide bomber - rammed his vehicle into the police van. However, he said the exact nature of the attack will be ascertained after investigation.

Pakistan has witnessed a spike in terror attacks in recent weeks and January was the deadliest month since 2018 with 134 people having lost their lives - a 139 per cent spike - and 254 others injured in at least 44 attacks across the country.

The bodies and injured personnel were shifted to the Sibi district where they were provided medical aid. The condition of some of the injured is critical.

On February 26, four people were killed, and 14 others injured in an IED blast at a market in Balochistan. (PTI)

CBI quizzes Rabri, summons Lalu

A similar notice has been issued to RJD supremo and former Bihar Chief Minister Lalu Prasad as well, the officials said but remained tight-lipped on the date of his questioning.

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has already filed its charge sheet in the case. The special court summoned the accused, including Prasad and his family members and others on March 15.

The agency has kept the probe open into the alleged scam and the new round of questioning of Yadav family members is in connection with "further investigation" in the case, they said.

Prasad's son and Bihar Deputy Chief Minister Tejashwi Yadav alleged that CBI's action was a result of his family's "relentless opposition" to the BJP.

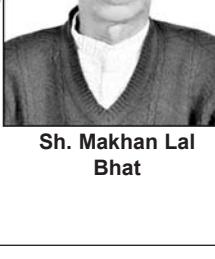

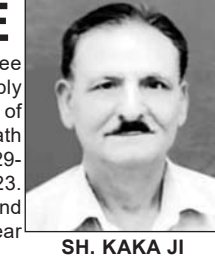

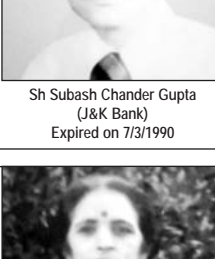
