**Admn finding it difficult to prevent fatal road accidents in hilly areas**

comparative deaths, grievous injuries, major accidents and non-injury accidents are less in Jammu and Kashmir as compared to other States", sources said, adding "this is, however, not a ground to counter the inaction to prevent increasing road accidents".

As per the official data, during 2020-21 financial year, audit of 126 roads was conducted, crash barriers were installed along 60,638 meters of road length, parapets installed along 70,778 meters, 10,968 signages and 5100 delineators were installed and 129 black spots were addressed.

Similarly, 175 roads were audited during 2022-23 financial year up to December 2022 while

as crash barriers were installed along 109092 meters, parapets installed along 17895 meters of road length, 11637 signages and 7569 delineators were installed and 60 black spots were addressed.

"No doubt this is significant achievement on the part of the concerned authorities but despite all this way accidents are on rise particularly in Doda-Kishtwar belt and this remains a million dollar question", sources said, adding "all the concerned agencies are required to sit together and try to chalk out the strategy so that fatal accidents are prevented, which is ultimately the objective behind huge expenditure being made by the administration".

**MS DH Shopian attached for mismanagement of hospital affairs**

Officer and duly countersigned by the respective Head of Department i.e. Director Health Service or Principal as the case may be, "but no such procedure has been adopted, instead, the then Medical Superintendent has favoured the illegally run medical shop for being run by a close relative of the present Medical Superintendent, thereby raising conflict of interest."

The balance amount to the tune of Rs. 21.505 lakh is still pending for depositum amid running the Medical store illegally and unauthorisedly beyond the expiry term without any extension order, thereby causing a huge loss to the Government exchequer.

"To prevent further illegal running of the said business involving precious human lives in government premises, the district administration Shopian attempted to evict the said illegal occupant number of occasions, but the said offender with the assistance of the Medical Superintendent tactfully deceived the Government by preferring writ petitions one after the other before the High Court of J&K and Ladakh at Srinagar and staying the eviction notices on one pretext or the other."

The Deputy Commissioner has also highlighted that the Jan Aushadi Kendra located in DH, Shopian has become completely defunct under the maladministration of the said Officer.

As per the details which have been given out in the attachment order, the Medical Superintendent, being the estate officer of DH Shopian has never bothered to put the illegal occupant to notice, "thereby helping them to loot the government exchequer."

The concerned officer has also been directed to explain his position as to why action under the rules may not be initiated against him for not taking any steps to stop the running of the illegal fair-price shop within the premise of District Hospital, Shopian. "The officer has stated that the incumbent MS District Hospital, Shopian has also been arrayed as party respondent at s. no. 06 in WP(C) No. 2911/2022 as such the officer was not able to initiate any proceedings against the illegal occupant."

But the question is, the order stated, that prior to the issuance of an order dated: 15.12.2022

followed by notice dated: 16.12.2022 by the Executive Magistrate 1st Class Shopian, "why the Medical Superintendent, DH Shopian being the Estate Officer of District Hospital Shopian has not taken any action against the illegal occupant of Fair Price Medical Shop."

The details note that it came to the fore that the issue of expiry of the contract term in respect of the illegally run Medical shop has never been raised anywhere, "thereby concealed the facts related to the matter which is unbecoming of a government employee and invites disciplinary action against the erring officer."

Coming down heavily on the officer, the Deputy Commissioner has stated that the failure of the officer to meet the expectations of his role as Medical Superintendent has been documented on several occasions; despite efforts, the officer "has failed to improve and this has had a negative impact on the quality of patient care and management of financial affairs of the institute."

"The negligence of the officer in the management of hospital resources has resulted in a significant financial loss to the UT exchequer. We take this matter very seriously as it goes against the principles of good governance and the proper use of public resources." It has been noted that his actions have not only caused financial damage, "but they have also put the health and safety of the patients at risk."

In the circumstantial background, the order stated, due to his failure to perform duties outlined in his job description and as required by law, pending enquiry into the conduct and performance of the officer, Khalid Abass Medical Superintendent, Shopian is hereby attached and the Deputy Chief Medical Officer, Shopian shall discharge the functions of Medical superintendent DH, Shopian till further orders.

The enquiry committee will have Additional District Magistrate, Shopian, Chief Medical Officer, Shopian, Accounts Officer with Deputy Commissioner, Shopian and District Litigation Officer, Shopian as its members. The committee will submit its report with recommendations within 15 days.

the tax base is proof that people have faith in the Government, and they believe that the tax paid is being spent for public good," he said.

He said Amrit Kaal Budget laid the roadmap of an all-inclusive financial sector for India's growth and India is moving with new capabilities, the responsibility of those in the financial world of India has increased.

Modi asked the banking sector that they have a robust financial system of the world and a banking system that is in profit after being on the verge of collapse 8-10 years ago.

Also, he said, there is a Government that is taking policy decisions with courage, clarity and confidence.

"Today, the need of the hour is that the benefits of the strength in India's banking system should reach the maximum number of people," he said.

Giving an example of the Government's support to the MSME sector, the prime minister asked the banking system to reach out to the maximum number of sectors.

"1 crore 20 lakh MSMEs have received huge help from the Government during the pandemic. In this year's budget, the MSME sector has also got additional collateral-free guaranteed credit of 2 lakh crores. Now it is very important that our banks reach out to them and provide them adequate finance," he said.

Modi pointed out that the Government's policies related to financial inclusion have made crores of people part of the formal financial system.

The Government has helped fulfil the dreams of crores of youth by giving Mudra loans of more than Rs 20 lakh crore without a bank guarantee, he said.

For the first time, he said, more than 40 lakh street vendors and small shopkeepers received help from banks through PM Swanidhi Yojana.

The prime minister said that the entire world is witnessing the impact of India's fiscal and monetary policy during the COVID-19 pandemic and lauding its efforts in strengthening the fundamentals of the country's economy in the last 9 years.

Recalling the time when the world looked at India with suspicion, he said that discussions on India's economy, budget and goals would often begin and end with a question.

He highlighted the changes in financial discipline, transparency and inclusive approach and noted that the question mark at the beginning and end of the

discussion has been replaced by 'vishwas' (trust) and 'apeksha' (expectations).

Touching upon the issue of 'vocal for local' he said that 'vocal is not a matter of choice but 'vocal for local and vision of self-reliance is a national responsibility'.

"Our exports have been at an all-time high, whether in goods or services. This indicates growing possibilities for India," he said, adding, the stakeholders like organisations and chambers of industry and commerce to take up the responsibility to promote local artisans and entrepreneurs up to the district level.

He clarified that 'vocal for local' is bigger than just buying products from the Indian cottage industry.

"We have to see which are the areas where we can save the country's money by building capacity in India itself," he said citing examples of higher education and edible oil where a lot of money goes out.

The Prime Minister said Indian talent, infrastructure and innovators can take the Indian financial system to the top.

"In the era of 'Industry 4.0', platforms developed by India are becoming models for the world," he said giving examples of Government e Marketplace (GeM) and digital transactions.

He said that in the 75th year of independence, 75,000 crore transactions were done digitally, which shows how wide the expansion of Unified Payments Interface (UPI) has become.

"RuPay and UPI are not just a low-cost and highly secure technology, but it is our identity in the world. There is immense scope for innovation. UPI should become a means of financial inclusion and empowerment for the whole world, we have to collectively work for it. I suggest that our financial institutions should also have maximum partnership with fintechs to increase their reach," he said.

Sometimes, even a small step can make a huge difference in boosting the economy, he said and gave the example of buying goods without the bill.

Pointing out that the feeling that there is no harm done by this, Modi underlined the need to increase awareness about getting a copy of the bill that will benefit the nation in return.

The benefits of India's economic development should reach every class and person, he said urging all stakeholders to work with this vision.

He also stressed creating a large pool of well-trained professionals. (PTI)

**Posts vacant for 2 years abolished**

in this regard were already there vide number 1/97(02)-Sgr-210(s), dated, 7/2021, according to which all posts, except newly created, kept in abeyance or remaining vacant for a period of more than two years in any department, would be considered as deemed abolished.

"The department shall

obtain the prior concurrence of the Finance department for revival of such posts before referring them for recruitment in unavoidable cases," read the fresh circular, adding that the department shall also not project the deemed abolished posts in the budget estimates/revised estimates.

**Five arrested in SIM cards scam**

GUWAHATI, Mar 8:

Five people were arrested from Nagaon and Morigaon districts of Assam for allegedly supplying SIM cards to Pakistani agents, a police spokesperson said today.

Several mobile phones, SIM cards and other incriminating materials, including a handset used to share defence information with a foreign embassy, were seized, he said.

Assam Police spokesperson Prasanta Bhuyan said the arrests were made during an operation carried out on Tuesday night, based on inputs from Intelligence Bureau and other sources.

"There were inputs that around 10 people from these two districts were involved in fraudulently procuring SIM cards from different service providers and supplying those to some Pakistani agents, thus working against the integrity and sovereignty of the nation," he said.

Five of the accused were arrested on Tuesday night, he

added. Those arrested were identified as Ashiqul Islam, Bodor Uddin, Mijanur Rahman and Wahiduz Zaman, all from Nagaon, and Baharul Islam from Morigaon.

Among the items recovered from the arrested people and houses of the other five absconding accused are 18 mobile phones, 136 SIM cards suspected to have been procured for fraudulent purposes, one fingerprint scanner, one high-tech CPU and some documents such as birth certificates, passbooks and photographs.

During interrogation, it was revealed that Ashiqul Islam was using a mobile handset with two IMEI numbers from which a WhatsApp call was made, sharing defence information with a foreign embassy.

"That specific mobile phone was found in his possession. Other nabbed people were also found technically involved in this connection. A thorough interrogation along with the IB officials is underway," Bhuyan added. (PTI)

**India slams Pak FM for raking up Kashmir**

UNITED NATIONS, Mar 8:

India tore into Pakistan after its Foreign Minister raised the issue of Jammu and Kashmir at a Security Council debate on women, peace and security, saying it is "unworthy" to even respond to such "malicious and false propaganda".

Responding to Pakistan Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari's remarks on Jammu and Kashmir, India's Permanent Representative to the UN Ambassador Ruchira Kamboj termed his statement as "baseless and politically motivated".

"Before I conclude, let me dismiss the frivolous, baseless and politically motivated remarks made by the delegate of Pakistan regarding the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir," she said.

Speaking at the UN Security Council open debate on 'Women, Peace and Security', Kamboj said: "my delegation considers it unworthy to even respond to such malicious and false propaganda."

"Rather, our focus is where it shall always be - positive and forward-looking. Today's discussion is critically important to strengthen our collective efforts to accelerate the full implementation of the Women, Peace and Security

agenda. We respect the topic of the debate and recognise the importance of time. As such, our focus shall remain on the topic," she said.

Kamboj's sharp retort came after Pakistan Foreign Minister Zardari referred to Jammu and Kashmir in his remarks to the Council debate held under Mozambique's Presidency for this month, on the eve of International Women's Day.

India has previously told Pakistan that the entire territories of the Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh have been, are, and shall always be part of India.

India has been maintaining that it desires normal neighbourly relations with Pakistan, while insisting that the onus is on Islamabad to create an environment that is free of terror and hostility for such an engagement.

The ties between India and Pakistan came under severe strain after India's warplanes pounded a Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) terrorist training camp in Pakistan's Balakot in February 2019 in response to the Pulwama terror attack.

The relations further deteriorated after India in August 2019 announced the withdrawal of Jammu and Kashmir's special powers and the bifurcation of the erstwhile state into Union Territories. (PTI)

"Janipur Police received a phone call last evening from a relative of the accused that the latter has shared on his facebook page that he is committing suicide as he is fed up with his life," sources said, adding, immediately a team of Police Station Janipur led by SHO Inspector Vijay Kumar reached the house of the accused at Pamposh Colony, where it found the main gate of the house locked from outside.

They said a case FIR Number 27/2023 under Section 302 was registered in this connection at Police Station Janipur and further investigation started. "In initial investigation, it came
