Whereas, among others you were appointed as Multitasking Staff (MTS) Under PSP category in J&K Funds Organization (Jammu Division) by Finance Department vide Government Order No. 281-FD of 2021 dated 22.10.2021 figuring at serial No. 39 of the said order.

Whereas, you joined this Directorate on 03.11.2021 and have mentioned two residential addresses in the joining report, permanent address as House No. 142, Ward No. 6, Mohalla Khorinar, District Poonch and A/P House No. 117, Lane No.-11, Adarsh Vihar, Channi Deeli, Bye-pass, Jammu. P.O Sainik Colony Jammu (J&K)-180011.

Whereas, after joining in this Directorate, you were further adjusted in District Fund Office, Poonch vide order No. 213-DGF of 2021 dated 29.11.2021.

Whereas, you did not bother to join your new place of posting till date willfully for the reasons best known to you. Whereas, you had remained un-authorizedly absent from your legitimate duties w.e.f 30.11.2021 i.e from the date of your further adjustment in District Fund Office Poonch as reported by Chief Accounts Officer, District Fund Office, Poonch time and again.

Whereas, District Fund Office Poonch issued Notice on 18.02.2022, to you for not joining to your new place of posting within the stipulated period as required under rules.

Whereas, accordingly Joint Director Funds Organization Jammu published three Show cause Notices consecutively in different leading Newspapers vide No. DIP/J-9759/22, (Punjab Kesri) DIP/J-11097/22 dated 04.11.2022 (Daily Excelsior, Amar Ujala) and DIP/J-12289/22 dated 28.11.2022 (State times, Amar Ujala).

Whereas, you did not respond to the Notices issued and did not resume your duties till date.

Whereas, your un-authorized absence from duties attracts action as warranted in terms of Article 128 of J&K Civil Service Rules (Volume I) of 1956 which reads as under:-
'Absence without leave or after the end of leave involves loss of appointment'.

Under the given circumstances, you are provided last and final opportunity to present yourself within ten days after the publication of this Show Cause Notice, for explaining the reasons of absence, failing which it shall be constructed that you have nothing to say in your defense and action as warranted in terms of Article 128 of J&K Civil Service Rules (Volume I) of 1956 and other relevant rules shall be initiated against you without any further notice.

EC comes up with Vote from Home option for voters above 80 yrs

BENGALURU, Mar 11: The Election Commission today said it has introduced the facility to Vote-from-Home (VFH) for people above 80 years of age and those with disabilities in the upcoming assembly elections in Karnataka.

Addressing reporters here, Chief Election Commissioner, Rajiv Kumar said, "For the first time the ECI is going to provide the facility to those above 80 years of age. Our teams will go there with a form-12D to exercise their franchise."

Though the EC encourages

those above 80 years to come to the polling station, those who cannot avail this facility, he added. Secrecy will be maintained and the entire process will be videographed, Kumar explained.

"All the political parties will be informed whenever there is a movement for Voting From Home (VFH)," he said.

For people with disabilities, a mobile application called 'Saksham' has been introduced, which they can login to and choose the option to vote.

Another mobile application, 'Suvridha' has been developed,

which is an online portal for candidates to file nominations and affidavits.

"Candidates can also use the SUVIDHA portal for seeking permission for meetings and rallies," the top election official said.

The ECI has also launched a campaign called Know Your Candidate (KYC) for the benefit of voters.

"Political parties have to inform the voters on their portals and social media platform as to why they chose a candidate with criminal background and gave ticket to contest the election," Kumar said. (PTI)

Need to work in "time-bound mission mode" to help artisans, small businesses: PM

NEW DELHI, Mar 11:

Prime Minister Narendra Modi today underlined the need for working in a "time-bound mission mode" to help artisans and persons associated with small businesses become part of the value chain.

Addressing the 12th and the last post-budget webinar on 'PM Vishwakarma Kaushal Samman', the Prime Minister said that empowering every section of the village is essential for India's development journey.

"For this, we will have to work in a time-bound mission mode," he said, adding PM Vishwakarma Yojana is aimed at handholding of artisans and people associated with small businesses, besides preserving the nation's rich traditions.

The government, the Prime Minister said, will provide a holistic institutional support to every Vishwakarma (artisans) to ensure that they get access to easy loans, skilling, technical support, digital empowerment, brand promotion, marketing and raw material.

"The objective of the scheme is to develop traditional artisans and craftsmen while preserving their rich tradition," he said.

"Our aim is that Vishwakarmas of today can become entrepreneurs of tomorrow. For this, sustainability is essential in their business model," the prime minister said.

Modi said that artisans and craftsmen can be strengthened when they become part of the value chain and pointed out that many of them can become suppliers and producers for the MSME (Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises) sector.

He said that the industry can increase production by linking these people with their needs where skill and quality training can be provided.

"This can be a win-win situation for every stakeholder. Corporate companies will get quality products at competitive prices. Banks' money will be invested in schemes which can be trusted. And this will show the widespread effect of the schemes of the government," the prime minister said.

He further said that startups can also create a huge market for craft products through the e-com-



merce model apart from helping them with better technology, design, packaging and financing.

The prime minister expressed confidence that the partnership with the private sector will be further strengthened through PM Vishwakarma scheme so that the innovation power and business acumen of the private sector can be maximised.

Asking all the stakeholders to prepare a robust blueprint for helping artisans and small businesses, he said the Centre on its part is trying to reach the people in remote parts of the country and many of them are getting the benefits of government schemes for the first time.

"Most of the artisans are from dalit, adivasi, backward communities or are women and to reach and provide benefit to them a practical strategy will be needed, he said.

Skilled craftsmen are symbols of the true spirit of self-reliant India, he said, stressing, "we need to reorient our skill infrastructure system according to the needs of Vishwakarmas (artisans and craftsmen) of the nation."

The government organised 12 post-budget webinars to seek ideas and suggestions for effectively implementing the initiatives announced in the Union Budget 2023. During these webinars, Modi said, stakeholders have suggested best possible ways for implementing the provisions of

the Budget.

The prime minister said that crores of jobs have been created by skilling youth under the Skill India Mission and setting up Kaushal Rozgar Kendras.

"Small artisans play an important role in the production of local crafts. PM Vishwakarma Yojana focuses on empowering them," he said, lamenting that this skilled workforce was neglected for a long time and their work was considered non-significant during the years of slavery.

Even after India's independence, the prime minister said, there was no intervention from the government to work for their betterment and as a result, many traditional ways of skill and craftsmanship were abandoned by the families so that they could make a living elsewhere.

"Skilled craftsmen are symbols of the true spirit of self-reliant India and our government considers such people as Vishwakarma of new India," he said.

The prime minister said similar to the benefit to street vendors through the PM SVANidhi scheme, PM Vishwakarma Yojana will benefit the artisans.

Modi also underlined the need for reorienting the skill infrastructure system according to the needs of Vishwakarma and added that the Mudra Yojana is providing loans worth crores of rupees to small businesses without any bank guarantee. (PTI)

BSF recovers 3 kg of heroin dropped by drone from Pak

AMRITSAR, Mar 11:

Border Security Force (BSF) personnel today recovered more than three kg of heroin dropped by a drone from Pakistan in an agricultural field along the border.

The BSF personnel fired at the drone, but it managed to return after dropping the consignment.

GMC directs for reconstitution of MMC

SRINAGAR, Mar 11: The Government Medical College (GMC), Srinagar has directed the concerned to reconstitute the Mortality and Morbidity Committee (MMC).

The directives have been issued to all the Clinical Heads of the Department and have been asked to reconstitute the departmental MCC, which, the order said, shall assist the HoD in selecting case files for monthly departmental review of 'Mortality and Serious Incident Case File Review'.

The same events, the order issued by the Principal, GMC Srinagar, must be discussed and reviewed in the department and a summary submitted to the undersigned every month.

JTC, SKF highlight migrants problems

JAMMU, Mar 11: A meeting of Jagti Tenement Committee (JTC) and Soan Kashmir Front J&K was held today under the chairmanship of its president Shadi Lal Pandita at Jagti township Nagrota near here, today.

Addressing the meeting Pandita said that the Government is doing great injustice with the Kashmiri Pandits who had been forced to live in exile for 33 years.

Pandita said that the Kashmiri Pandits/migrant relief holders are worried about the rising inflation while the monthly cash relief of relief holders is quite low which needs to be increased from Rs 13,000 to Rs 25,000 immediately.

Pandita said Kashmiri Pandits putting up in Jammu and different parts of India have suffered a huge loss in shape of crops as they could not cultivate their agriculture fields in last 33 years. He demanded a lump sum compensation for the same.

Pandita also demanded security to all package employees serving in Valley besides free accommodation to them and release of salaries of previous months.

Officials said 3.055 kg of heroin was recovered from the agricultural field in Dhanoo Kalan village in Amritsar.

In a statement issued here, a BSF official stated the consignment was smuggled into India from Pakistan through a drone in the early hours of Saturday.

"As per the laid down drill, troops endeavoured to intercept the drone by firing. The troops deployed in depth areas also heard the sound of something dropping in the farming fields," the official stated.

The drone after dropping the drug consignment in Indian territory moved back to its origin, the official added. (PTI)

Four drug peddlers held with 16.7 gm heroin

JAMMU, Mar 11: At least four drug peddlers were held today in Jammu District and 16.7 grams of heroin was recovered from their possession, police said.

They said 5.2 grams of heroin was recovered at a naka placed at Satriyan near Shamsan Ghat in RS Pura area from two accused identified as Arun @Nikhil Chib @Goo and Arjun Singh @Ajju, both residents of Satriyan Khurd, Tehsil Suchetgarh, Jammu and 5.5 grams of heroin was recovered from one Zakir Hussain of Jaura, Tehsil Suchetgarh, Jammu, at a naka placed near Kotli area.

Meanwhile, 6 grams of heroin was recovered from one person identified as Ajay Kumar of Barjala, Jammu South, during a routine naka checking at Phallain Mandal.

Police have registered separate cases under relevant sections of the law and taken up further investigation.

Cattle-shed catches fire, 8 sheep die

RAJOURI, Mar 11: Eight cattle were charred to death as a cattle-shed caught fire in Dodasan Balla area of Thannamandi Tehsil last night.

Official sources said that cattle-shed of one Pervaiz Ahmed, son of Jamal Din, resident of Kallar, Dodasan Balla, Thannamandi damaged in a fire incident in which eight sheep were said to be charred to death.

The locals said that the victim is a very poor person and has no source of income and his only source of income was these sheep. The cause of fire not yet known however, Thannamandi Police have registered a case and started investigation.
