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J&K enhances ex-gratia for martyrs' kin



Administrative Council meeting being chaired by LG Manoj Sinha in Jammu on Monday.

CAPF personnel from Jammu and Kashmir who attain martyrdom in the line of duty, within or outside the territorial jurisdiction of Jammu & Kashmir, will receive ex-gratia relief equivalent to that provided to the martyrs of Defence personnel. The decision demonstrates the UT administration's commitment to supporting the NoKs of security forces who make the supreme sacrifice in service to the nation. As per the decision, the NoKs of martyred CAPF personnel will now receive Rs 25 lakh as ex-gratia relief, a substantial increase from the previous amount of Rs 5 lakh.

Meanwhile, Administrative Council also approved the proposals of different departments for transfer of land for various public purposes.

The Administrative Council transferred land in favour of Power Development Department for augmentation of power supply in different areas. The AC transferred 42 Kanal 15 Marla situated at village Pohrupeth, Tehsil Langate, District Kupwara for construction of 315 MVA, 220/132 KV GIS Grid Sub-station, land measuring 2 Kanal situated at village Noorpora, Tehsil Awantipora, District Pulwama for construction of new 33/11 KV Substation in district Pulwama and land measuring 1 Kanal 10 Marla situated at village Odina, Tehsil

Sumbal, District Bandipora for construction of 3.15 MVA, 33/11 KV receiving station for providing electricity to the transit accommodation for PM Package employees.

Moreover the AC also decided to transfer land measuring 80 Kanal 4 Marla (20 Kanal at District Srinagar and land measuring 60 Kanal 4 Marla at village Ranbirpora, District Anantnag) in favour of Department of Disaster Management Relief, Rehabilitation and Reconstruction (DMRRR) for construction of transit accommodations in Srinagar and Anantnag districts for Kashmiri Migrant Government employees appointed under Prime Minister's Package.

Shifting of PSA detainees involves national security: Centre

A bench of Chief Justice DY Chandrachud and Justices PS Narasimha and JB Pardiwala was hearing a plea filed by Srinagar resident Raja Begum and three others through lawyer Satya Mitra challenging the transfer of detainees to jails outside the UT in alleged violation of the provisions of the law under which they had been detained. Solicitor General Tushar Mehta told the court, "We will take instructions but these are issues of genuine national security. It may not be as simple as just communication between two people."

Arif Ahmad Sheikh, son of Raja Begum, a resident of Parimpora in Srinagar, was shifted to the Central Jail in Varanasi in Uttar Pradesh. He was detained under the PSA on April 7 last year.

The plea alleged that over 20 people, detained under the public safety law, have been shifted out of the Union Territory prisons to jails in Uttar Pradesh and Haryana. During the hearing,

the counsel appearing for the petitioners said their families are unable to communicate with the detainees.

"They have taken immense pain. Some sort of communication needs to be established. Family members are not allowed to communicate. They belong to very poor background and for them travelling to visit him (Sheikh) is impossible," she said.

The top court posted the matter for further hearing on April 5.

On November 4 last year, the top court had sought responses from the Centre, the Jammu and Kashmir Government and others to the plea.

The plea said people detained under the local law cannot be moved out of the Union Territory as the statute was applicable to the Union Territory only.

The people are in preventive detention under the provisions of the Jammu and Kashmir Public Safety Act, 1978. (PTI)

SIU attaches house

Unit attached house of one Mohammad Ishaq Malik son of Mohammad Saifullah Malik, resident of Dhanwatehpura Kokernag, under section 25 of UA(PJA), for his alleged involvement in militant activities", an SIU spokesperson said in a statement.

The accused, the statement read, is involved in case FIR number 103/2022 under section 307 IPC, 7/27 Arms Act 18, 20, 23, 38 UAP Act of Police Station Kokernag and is presently

lodged in District Jail Anantnag.

"SIU went to the specific location under a posse of security men and pasted the notice on the house in the presence of local Sarpanches, Panches and Chowkidars. According to the notice, the owner of the house has been restrained to 'transfer, lease out, dispose off, change its nature or deal with the said property in any manner without the permission of designated authority", read the statement further.

LG Ladakh calls on Prez, Vice Prez, PM

This was Mishra's first meeting with the President, Vice President and Prime Minister after taking over charge as the Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh from Radha Krishna Mathur.

Mishra was Governor of Arunachal Pradesh before being shifted to Ladakh.

A tweet by the President of India said: "Brig (Dr) BD Mishra, Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh, called on President Droupadi Murmu at Rashtrapati Bhawan".

Almost similar tweet by the Vice President of India informed about Mishra's meeting with Jagdeep Dhankhar.

The Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh also called on Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Though there was no official word on what transpired at the meetings, sources said these were "courtesy calls" by Mishra to the President, Vice President and Prime Minister after taking over as the Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh.

However, the issues pertaining to the Union Territory of Ladakh were reported to have figured in the meetings. Sources said Mishra is likely to

call on some Union Ministers and other dignitaries also during his stay in the Union capital.

Mishra was posted as the Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh amidst intensified agitation by the Leh Apex Body (LAB) and Kargil Democratic Alliance (KDA) in support of their demands including Statehood and Sixth Schedule status to Ladakh, two Parliamentary seats in the Union Territory and jobs for locals among other issues.

The LAB and KDA had staged protest demonstrations in Jammu followed by Jantar Mantar in New Delhi in support of their demands.

After takeover, Mishra has so far not invited LAB and KDA for talks though some individuals met him at Raj Niwas in Leh. The Union Home Ministry has constituted a High Powered Committee headed by Union Minister of State for Home Nityanand Rai but LAB and KDA have sought changes in the Panel as well as agenda released for discussions.

There were reports that the Union Home Ministry might agree to certain changes in the High Powered Committee as well as agenda but there has been no clarity on this. Reports also suggested that some backchannel talks are on between Home Ministry officials and a senior leader of LAB.

LG alleges attempts by vested interests to derail recruitment process in J&K

virtually difficult for him to run the administration with such people in Government jobs.

"There were people in Government jobs who did not come to the office. Such people are now facing difficulties and they must experience it because the salary is given from the taxes of common people," he said.

Alleging that attempts were being made by such people to derail the recruitment process, Manoj Sinha urged the youth not to get influenced by the instigating elements who set their dreams on fire for their own vested interests.

The Lt Governor said that Government will ensure fair and transparent recruitment. Jobs will be given on the basis of merit and not on recommendation, he said and added that if any irregularity is detected, the Government will take strictest action and the erring persons will not be spared.

These comments of LG came in light of protests by some job aspirants against hiring of a previously blacklisted company for conducting the recruitment tests by the J&K Services Selection Board.

"Gone are the days when jobs were sold and given on recommendations of some influential. I assure the youth that the entire recruitment will be made purely on the basis of merit and competence," he said and appealed the agitating youth that there was no need to take out candle march protests as Government was committed for not allowing any irregularity in the entire process.

The Lt Governor reminded that earlier the Government had received complaints and without any delay the case was investigated internally and subsequently handed over to the CBI.

"I once again assure the young aspirants that anyone found guilty will not be spared. We have ensured transparent selection process. Some youth have raised questions and I want to tell them that if they find any irregularity at any point, let them come forward with facts and we will conduct an independent inquiry for strict action against the erring persons. But don't pay heed to rumours by the vested interests," he maintained.

The Lt Governor said the recent fast-track recruitment process by the Public Service Commission is an example of the transparent system. Within three hours of the interview of the last candidate, the results were declared and such transparency is unheard of in any other region of the country, he added.

Power connections of over 100 industrial, commercial establishments disconnected

As per the official details available with EXCELSIOR, power connection of Jai Maa Disposables industrial unit located in Bari Brahmanna Phase-II has been disconnected for failure to clear outstanding bill of Rs 1.97 crore. Similarly, power connection of J K Premier Cement, which has failed to clear arrears of Rs 1.42 crore, has been disconnected. Another big defaulter whose power connection has been disconnected is VEE ELL CEE Industries at Bari Brahmanna. This unit has failed to clear arrears of Rs 1.47 crore.

The power connection of Fresh Bakes at Gangyal has been disconnected for failure to clear electricity bills of Rs 53527 while as action has been taken against Sharda Enterprises for not coming forward to clear Rs 51694 worth electricity bills.

Yardman Industries situated at Gangyal has been taken to task by the JPDCI for failure to clear outstanding bills to the tune of Rs 1298151 while as power connection of Krishna Steel Works has been disconnected for not clearing outstanding bills of Rs 79589. Likewise, Ishita Industries' power connection has been disconnected for not clearing

The LG pointed out that in the last three years, 30,000 recruitments were made and the Government was hopeful that a minimum 12,000 more recruitments would be done this year.

Earlier, on the occasion, Manoj Sinha inaugurated and laid foundation stones of projects worth more than Rs 155 Cr under Jammu Smart City. "New projects are part of our systematic effort to improve quality of life, create smart economy by fostering productivity and improved city services," he observed.

The Lt Governor said, the Integrated Command & Control Centre (ICCC), as a nerve centre of civic operations, will bring together all different departments to manage the city's utilities, civic services. ICCC will ensure quick response in the time of emergency, he added.

The Lt Governor highlighted the efforts made in the last three years to establish a citizen-centric system in J&K. He said that Jammu city is emerging as one of the best cities of the country. It also provides a significant opportunity for development and growth, he added.

The Lt Governor also distributed QR Based Digital Number plates to the residents of Jammu. Unique digital IDs for residential and commercial properties will help in delivering efficient services in a sustainable manner, he said.

The projects inaugurated today by the Lt Governor also include various projects of Jammu Municipal Corporation under the AMRUT scheme worth Rs 23.83 Cr and construction/improvement of drains & nullahs under Langushing at a cost of Rs 7 Cr. These projects will improve the drainage system of Rajeev Nagar, Sundar Nagar, Trikuta Nagar, Nanak Nagar and other areas and benefit the lakhs of citizens. The Lt Governor also laid the foundation stone for a parking facility at Town Hall, JMC.

H Rajesh Prasad, Principal Secretary Housing & Urban Development Department and Rahul Yadav, Commissioner JMC gave a detailed briefing on the projects.

They further said, "the drive will continue against all the defaulters in all the categories of the consumers as JPDCI, as directed by the Government, has decided not to spare anyone".

network by the end of 2023. The Government also plans to roll out light metro rail in Jammu and Srinagar during the next financial year.

The Finance Minister said Jammu and Kashmir's economy is also on right track and it is expected to grow at 10 per cent. There has been significant growth in collections under GST, Excise and Stamp Duty, she added.

The budget has a provision of Rs 1313 crore for Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) and Urban Local Bodies (ULBs), Rs 5000 crore for Jal Jeevan Mission (JIM), Rs 140 crore for Metro Corporations, Rs 100 crore for Jammu and Srinagar City grants, Rs 400 crore for construction of transit accommodation for Kashmiri migrants, Rs 520 crore for Smart City projects under the Centrally Sponsored Schemes and UT sector, Rs 200 crore including Rs 10 crore each earmarked as Development Fund for 20 District Development Councils and Rs 71.25 crore at the rate of Rs 25 lakh each as Development Fund for 285 Block Development Councils, Rs 40 crore for Panchayati Raj Institutions Security and Rs 120 crore for establishment of DDC/BDC/PRI accommodation and offices.

"The tax/GDP ratio is projected at 8.82 per cent for 2023-24 which is higher than the previous year of 7.77 per cent," Sitharaman said.

She said the debt/GDP ratio for 2023-24 was pegged as 49 per cent and the GDP growth for the Union territory for 2023-24 has been projected at Rs 2,30,727 crore which shows a growth of 10 per cent over the previous year.

All 18.36 lakh households of Jammu and Kashmir will have functional tap connections by 2023-24, Sitharaman said, adding that every household will be provided drinking water with minimum 55 litres per capita per day and of prescribed quality on regular, long term and sustainable basis.

The Finance Minister has allocated Rs 2,526.74 crore to Agriculture and Horticulture; Rs 2,097.53 crore to Health and Medical Education; Rs 4,169.26 crore to Rural Department; Rs 1,964.90 crore to Power sector; Rs 7,161 crore to Jal Shakti; Rs 2,928.04 crore to Housing and Urban Development; Rs 1,521.87 crore to Education; and Rs 4,062.87 crore to construction of roads and bridges.

As per the budget document, total revenue budget of Administrative sector is Rs 14069 crore of which 73 per cent is expected to be spent on Home department. Similarly, the total revenue budget of Social sector is Rs 24,580 crore, of which, expenditure to the extent of 49 per cent will be done on Education.

Total Revenue budget of Infrastructure sector is Rs 32973 crore and 71 per cent will be spent through the finance Department.

In Administrative sector, Capital budget is Rs 1802 crore. Out of this, 44 per cent will be spent on Home Department. In Rs 5023 crore Capital budget of social sector, 42 per cent will be spent on Health and Medical Education Department.

In Infrastructure, total capital budget is Rs 26013 crore and 22 per cent of it will be used by the Jal Shakti Department. In Economic sector, total capital budget stood at Rs 8654 crore and 48 per cent expenditure will be done by the Rural Development Department.

Sitharaman said J&K has been among top performers in the country for implementation of Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY), Amrit Sarovar, SVAMITVA Scheme, Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, Nasha Mukta Abhiyan and renewable energy development.

"Besides, Jammu and Kashmir is among top performers in agriculture income, ease of living, ease of doing business, transparency, sustainable development goals and one nation, one ration card," read the speech. The Finance Minister said that Jammu and Kashmir leads the nation under various health parameters like neo-natal mortality rate, infant mortality rate, sex ratio at birth, institutional births and percentage of fully immunized children. She further said that Jammu & Kashmir government has made concerted efforts to introduce multitude of reforms like establishment of grassroots level democracy, creation of knowledge society and expansion of digital and physical connectivity. "More than 445 services are now being provided in online mode in Jammu and Kashmir. Offline services have been completely stopped thus ushering a new digital era in Jammu and Kashmir," the budget speech read. The Finance Minister also said that the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir is the first among States/Union Territories to have district good governance Index for assessing the public service delivery at district level. "Two new unique initiatives 'Aspirational Panchayat Development Programme' with an objective to provide financial assistance of Rs. 10.00 Lakh to selected 285 Panchayats (one Panchayat per Block) for their holistic development and 'Aspirational Towns Development Programme' for holistic development of selected Aspirational Towns has been launched during 2022-23. A Panchayat Development Index and Town Development Index have also been developed to measure the progress," she said. "Road infrastructure by way of construction of mega highways and tunnel projects is in progress. A number of highway projects are presently under execution. Work on Srinagar-Jammu national highway is being completed in next 2-3 years bringing much respite for the people of Jammu & Kashmir," she added. She said that power generation capacity will be doubled in 3 years. "In last 2 years alone, projects of more than 3000 MW capacity have been revived and put on track. Work on 1000 MW Pakal Dul and 624 MW Kiru is in full swing. 850 MW Ratle has been awarded. Preconstruction activities have been initiated for 1856 MW Sawalkote project by NHPC," she said. Talking about employment, the Finance Minister said that largest-ever recruitment drive has been initiated in Jammu & Kashmir. "33426 Posts have been referred to recruiting agencies, against which 25450 selections have been made including 2436 selections of Jammu and Kashmir Bank Limited. Remaining are under process for fast track recruitment," she said. Sitharaman said over 1.88 crore tourists visited Jammu and Kashmir during previous year up to December, 2022. "Out of this 26.73 lakh tourists visited Kashmir which is more than double than the previous highest of 12.99 lakh in the year 2016. For the first time, the world famous Gulmarg Gondola has realized revenue of about Rs. 100 crore," she said. In a major push for agriculture and horticulture sectors, Rs 1239.45 crore has been allocated more to it than the previous year's budget allocation. "For agriculture and horticulture sectors, an allocation of about Rs. 2526.74 crore has been made under capital expenditure for the year 2023-24 which is Rs. 1239.45 crore more than previous year's budget allocation," read the budget documents. The Jammu & Kashmir Holistic Agriculture Development Plan will be rolled out which will make horizontal change in the agriculture sector in the Union Territory of Jammu

and Kashmir. "Under this plan, 29 projects have been approved with an outlay of Rs 5,012 crore over a period of next five years. This will transform the agriculture economy of Jammu and Kashmir putting it on a new trajectory of growth, doubling the output of sectors, boosting exports and making the sectors sustainable and commercially viable," the budget document stated.

"It will herald a new phase of farming prosperity and rural livelihood security in Jammu and Kashmir and create additional job opportunities to 2, 87,910 people in agriculture and allied sectors. 18,861 new business enterprises will be created over the period of next five years", the budget documents said.

The Health and Medical Education sector has been allocated Rs 2097.53 crore under capital expenditure for the year 2023-24, which is Rs 214.97 crore more than the previous year's budget allocation.

"For rural sector, an allocation of about Rs. 4169.26 crore has been made under capital expenditure for the year 2023-24, which is Rs 54.31 crore more than the previous year's budget allocation."

"For tourism and culture sectors, an allocation of about Rs 457.39 crore has been made under capital expenditure for the year 2023-24 which is Rs 54.31 crore more than the previous year's budget allocation," the document stated.

An allocation of about Rs. 1964.90 crore has been made under capital expenditure for Power sector.

"For housing and urban development, an allocation of about Rs 457.39 crore has been made under capital expenditure for the year 2023-24, which is Rs 31.91 crore more than the previous year's budget allocation."

The Jal Shakti department has been allocated Rs 7161 crore under capital expenditure for 2023-24, which is Rs. 3191 crore more than the previous year's budget allocation.

In the budget, an allocation of about Rs. 2928.04 crore has been made under capital expenditure for Housing & Urban Development Department for the year 2023-24 which is Rs. 674.78 crore more than the previous year's budget allocation.

An allocation of about Rs 1521.87 crore has been made under capital expenditure for School Education and Higher Education sectors for the year 2023-24, which is Rs 193.61 crore more than the previous year's budget allocation.

The road and bridge sector will get an allocation of about Rs 4062.87 crore under capital expenditure for the year 2023-24, which is Rs 98.99 crore more than the previous year's budget allocation.

The Centre has also proposed several security-related activities which will be taken up during the next fiscal.

The police border posts will be set-up in all the border districts of Jammu and Kashmir. The budget document talked about strengthening of crime organization in J&K.

As part of security measures for jails, the budget proposed construction and erection of dominant towers/jammers in jails.

The Government said that CCTV surveillance systems will be completed in all police stations.

It also talks about installation of CCTV cameras with command and control centres at public places.

Aiming to empower womenfolk in Jammu & Kashmir, the Union Territory's budget for the next fiscal has unveiled a slew of measures for women-led development.

The budget document, spoke about establishing "Ladies Haat" and "Ladies Exclusive Markets" at Srinagar and other major towns.

The budget document also stated that women guides would be encouraged at tourist places. In the budget document, the government also talked about the creation of hubs for the empowerment of women (HEW)-Mahila Shakti Kendras, the establishment of GPS-enabled women helpline and the construction of working women hostels.

It referred to setting up of women-led Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) in the Cooperative sector.

In a move aimed at providing safe commute options for the womenfolk, the budget proposed the introduction of buses and pink taxis for them.

It also talks about women-only bus drivers and conductors

The budget for proposed that the Higher Education Council would be made functional during the next fiscal.

"National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) accreditation of 32 colleges will be completed in 2023-24," it read.

It also stated that 'ERP e-Gov Suite, will be fully implemented in 2023-24 with an aim at managing HRM, estate and inventory of Government Colleges and creating a centralized admission with student life cycle.

"Higher Education Council to be made functional during 2023-24. Eight college buildings and four hostel buildings likely to be completed in 2023-24," it read.

The document further stated that in Jammu and Kashmir four auditoriums and four multipurpose halls are likely to be completed in 2023-24. Besides, two library blocks are also likely to be completed in this financial year.

According to the Jammu and budget document "88 Virtual Reality Labs in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir that includes one lab in each zone to inculcate the scientific temper among students."

"At least 40 Robotic Labs to be established including two labs in each district to help in improving the school's digital equity, literacy and economic development besides, new teaching methodologies," it said.

It also said that Yoga training for all the students to keep them fit should be introduced as part of co-curricular activities.
