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AC nod for amendment in Pharmacy Act to end uncertainty over fate of Medical Asstts

Act, subject to an application to be made in this behalf within a period of one year commencing from the date of re-notification and payment of such fee as may be prescribed by the Administration of Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

This is for the third time that the J&K Administrative Council has given its nod for amendment in Section 32-C of the Pharmacy Act as earlier approvals for the same were returned by the Union Home Ministry for re-examining on some technical grounds.

Pertinent to mention that the J&K Pharmacy Act 2011 was replaced with the Central Pharmacy Act 1948 as per the provisions of J&K Reorganization Act, vide gazette notification, dated 30-10-2019. Thereafter, Union Ministry of Home Affairs issued an order under S.O 3465(E), dated 05-10-2020 incorporating Section 32-C in the Central Pharmacy Act, which says that any person whose name has been entered in the register of Pharmacists maintained under the J&K Pharmacy Act, 2011 and possesses qualification prescribed under the said Act, shall be deemed to have been entered in the register of Pharmacists prepared and maintained under Chapter IV of this Act, subject to an application to be made in this behalf within a period of one year commencing from October 31, 2020.

However, there are around 2400 Medical Assistants/Pharmacists in Government service and more than 22000 candidates who had either completed or were pursuing the course of Medical Assistant/Pharmacist from the institutions duly recognized by the erstwhile J&K Para Medical Council at that time but were not registered under J&K Pharmacy Act.

Earlier, these Medical Assistants/Pharmacists did not apply for the registration because there was no need for the same to join Government service in the erstwhile State of J&K and Medical Assistants/Pharmacists in Government sector were exempted from obtaining a license under provisions of Drug & Cosmetic Act 1940 and Rules there under. Similarly, the candidates pursuing Medical Assistant/Pharmacist course from the institutes recognized by J&K State Para Medical Council were primarily relying on the prospect of getting a Government job and thus had not applied for the registration, which was considered last resort for self employment in case they fail to get a Government job.

However, following replace-

ment of J&K Pharmacy Act by the Central Pharmacy Act in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, only those having B Pharma or Pharma D Course from a PCI approved institutions are now eligible for the registration and carrying out the practice and profession of Pharmacy.

While the matter in respect of those already registered under J&K Pharmacy Act got resolved by inserting Section 32-C in the Central Act, uncertainty continued to loom large over the fate of leftover Pharmacists.

The Excelsior had carried a series of stories highlighting the grievance of the leftover Pharmacists, particularly those unemployed youth who have completed the course from duly recognized institutions but were not registered.

After the matter was taken up by the Health & Medical Education Department of J&K Government, Pharmacy Council of India principally agreed for necessary amendment in Section 32-C and asked the J&K Govt to get the amendment in this regard approved from Parliament so that Statutory Order on extending registration to leftover Pharmacists could be issued.

However, the proposal for carrying out amendment in the Section 32-C and approved by the J&K Administrative Council, was twice returned by the Union Home Ministry on technical reasons in language of the draft and thus the matter remained pending for the last two years.

In its latest communication to the J&K Government, dated December 28, 2022, the Ministry of Home Affairs suggested that a revised amendment proposal in the lines similar to the proposal of the Administration of UT of Ladakh may be sent to the Ministry so that a consolidated proposal may be forwarded to the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare for taking necessary action in the matter.

And now a fresh draft proposal in the lines similar to the proposal of the Ladakh UT Administration has been prepared and approved by the J&K Administrative Council. After examining the proposal, the Union Home Ministry will forward the same to the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare for approval of the Parliament and necessary action so that amendment in Section 32-C of Pharmacy Act may be affected.

The necessary amendment will salvage career of more than 24 unregistered Pharmacists in J&K, who possess Diploma in Medical Assistant/Pharmacist and those pursuing the said course in the institutions recognized by the erstwhile J&K Para Medical Council at the time of introduction of J&K Reorganization Act 2019.

Courts not equipped to decide feasibility of any project: DB

ments have examined the issue and found the objections raised by the petitioners technically not feasible".

"The courts are not equipped with necessary expertise to decide upon the issues relating to the viability and feasibility of any project, which in fact are the technical matters and the decision is taken by people equipped with the necessary expertise", the DB said, adding "to decide as to on which side of the road, the land should be acquired, the court cannot super impose its opinion in the matter. Any interference in the case would delay the strategic project".

"The allegations of malafides alleged by the petitioner qua the whole process of acquisition and road widening also has been very well dealt with by Deputy Commissioner, Rajouri leaving no scope for this court to intervene and interfere", the DB said, adding "it is worth reiterating that the consistent view of the Constitutional courts in the matters of land acquisitions has been that the viability or feasibility in the process of acquisition does not fall with the domain of courts unless it ex facie is found to be contrary to law or is tainted with palpable malafides".

With these observations, the DB refused to interfere and dismissed the petition.

The case before the Division Bench was that the Border Roads Organization undertook the task of widening/four laning of Rajori - Thannamandi - Surankote Road having the length of approximately 57 Kms. Due to socio-economic development in the area the traffic has considerably increased and the road was in deplorable condition having big potholes throughout Rajori to Thannamandi causing grave hardships and inconvenience to the civilians and Military.

Accordingly, the proposal/indent for improvement and widening/double laning of the road was placed initially from Kms 3.900 to 25.200 on 24.07.2019 before the Revenue Authorities for the acquisition of land. Some of the land owners in order to get their lands out of purview of acquisition filed a Writ Petition bearing No. WP(C) No. 4193/2009 before the High Court and the Writ Petition was disposed of by virtue of judgment/order dated 15.11.2019 with an observation that in case the process initiated for acquisition of land under the Land Acquisition Act, 1999 is to proceed further, the land owners shall be afforded opportunity of hearing in support of the objections filed by them under Section 5A of the Act.

Thereafter, the respondents decided to change the align-

ment of the road by reducing the width from 24 meters to 12 meters within Km 12.910 to Km 17.680. The local residents filed a Writ Petition before the court bearing WP(C) No. 1621/2021 challenging the action of the respondents. The Writ Petition came upon for consideration before the court on 13.08.2021 and on the said date the same was disposed of with a direction to the respondents to consider and decide the Legal Notice served by the petitioner/local inhabitants.

Thereafter towards the implementation of order dated 13.08.2021 passed by the court, the respondent issued the impugned order No. Coll/Def/2021/1216-20 dated 15.09.2021 by rejecting the case of the petitioners.

The respondents submitted before the Division Bench that petitioner's plea to increase the width of the road from 12 Meters to 24 Meters within Kms 12.910 to Kms 17.960 is not possible as the acquisition in question has already been completed and the site has also been handed over to the contractor for execution.

Further, the DB was apprised that petitioners are encroachers of the land owned by Irrigation Department, which has issued notices for removal of the encroachments as such the petitioners with malafide intentions and in order to stall the process of acquisition filed petition with ulterior motives.

tively. But thereafter, no communication has been received from their end, Keen said.

Chief Medical Officer, Jammu, Dr Harbaksh Singh when contacted said that constructing agency (JK Housing Board) has to clear Rs 15 lakh bill of Power Development Department. This is the power they consumed during construction of this new building. The PDD is not issuing new power connection for this hospital till this old liability is cleared. The issue has been taken afresh with the senior officials of the PDD and the JK Housing Board. It is hoped that the matter would be resolved within a week's time, he added.

The CMO further said that building has not been officially handed over to them yet by the JK Housing Board. About 50 % of the equipment and furniture of the old hospital has been shifted to the new hospital complex and the remaining is also being shifted. Singh claimed that within next one week the new hospital will be made operational at Akhnoor.

Meanwhile, former Minister and senior BJP leader, Sham Lal Sharma and ex-MLA Rajeev Sharma have said that the money saved out of this project should be utilized to increase further facilities at new hospital, including additional infrastructure, beautification with additional tower lights along entrance, green cover inside the complex with trees, benches for patients and attendants and creating sufficient parking site inside for visitors/attendants of the patients. 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J&K receives Rs 1547 cr investment in current FY

JAMMU, Mar 14: A record investment of Rs 1,547 crore has been received by Jammu and Kashmir in the current fiscal till January, Union Minister of State for Home Nityanand Rai said in the Lok Sabha today.

Rai said the Government expects investments to further increase in the next five years in various important sectors like manufacturing, services, health-care and pharmaceuticals, agro-based industry, and tourism, including film and medical.

During 2022-23 till January, a record investment of Rs 1,547.87 crore has been received by the Union Territory and this investment during the current financial year is the highest ever compared to any of the previous financial years, he said replying to a written question.

The Minister said Jammu and Kashmir had received investment of Rs 376.76 crore in 2021-22, Rs 412.74 crore in 2020-21, Rs 296.64 crore in 2019-20, Rs 590.97 crore in 2018-19 and Rs 840.55 crore in 2017-18.

He said the Government of Jammu and Kashmir has already received investment proposals worth Rs 64,058 crore.

The Central Government has notified the new Central sector scheme for industrial development of Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir on February 19, 2021, and various policy initiatives have been taken by the authorities, Rai said.

Meanwhile, between October 1, 2019 and December, 2022, the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has regis-

tered 1164 cases of Human Rights violations from Jammu and Kashmir.

This information was also tabled in the Lok Sabha by Nityanand Rai in reply to a written question of National Conference Member Parliament, Hasnain Masoodi.

"Total 1164 cases pertaining to the State of Jammu and Kashmir have been registered with the NHRC from 1st October, 2019 to December, 2022, as per the information provided by NHRC."

"Out of those, 111 have been considered and closed by the Commission, 368 have been disposed of with direction, 484 have been dismissed in limini, compensation has been recommended in one case and 200 cases are pending for consideration of the Commission," the Union MoS Home told the Lok Sabha.

Masoodi had sought the details about total number of fresh cases registered with Jammu & Kashmir with the National Human Rights Commission from October 2019 to December 2022.

To another question of the NC MP about the total cases pending with the erstwhile State Human Rights Commission (SHRC) at the time of its winding up in view of the Reorganization of Jammu and Kashmir post abrogation of Article 370, the Union MoS Home said, "by virtue of the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganization Act, 2019, the Jammu and Kashmir Protection of Human Rights Act, 1997 has been repealed, and the application of corresponding Central Act i.e. The Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993 has come into force."
