

# UIDAI makes Aadhaar document update facility online free till June 14

NEW DELHI, Mar 15: The Unique Identification Authority of India has made document update facility online for Aadhaar free till June 14, an official statement said on Wednesday.

Earlier, residents were required to pay Rs 25 to update their documents on the Aadhaar portal.

"The Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) has decided to allow residents to update documents in their Aadhaar online free of cost, a people-centric move that will benefit millions of residents...The free service is available for the next three months, i.e., March 15 to June 14, 2023," the official statement said.

As per Aadhaar Enrolment and Update Regulations, 2016, Aadhaar number holders may, on completion of every 10 years from the date of enrolment for Aadhaar, update their supporting documents in Aadhaar, at least once, by submitting proof of identity (POI) and proof of address (POA) documents, so as to ensure the continued accuracy of their information.

"It is important to note that this service is free only on myAadhaar portal and will

continue to attract a fee of Rs 50 at physical Aadhaar centres, as in the case earlier," the statement said.

However, normal charges will apply in case a document is submitted to change demographic details (Name, Date of Birth, Address, etc).

Updated documents help in improved ease of living, better service delivery by the Government and enhances Aadhaar authentication success rate.

"The UIDAI has been encouraging residents to upload Proof of Identity and Proof of Address (PoI/PoA) documents to revalidate their demographic details, especially if Aadhaar was issued 10 years back and never got updated. This will help in improved ease of living, better service delivery and enhances authentication success rate," the statement said.

Nearly 1,200 Government schemes and programmes, run by the central and state governments, are using Aadhaar-based identification for the delivery of services. Besides, several other services, including financial institutions like Banks, NBFCs, etc are also using Aadhaar to authenticate and onboard customers seamlessly. (PTI)

# GMC Baramulla performs path-breaking surgery in colorectal cancer

SRINAGAR, Mar 15: The Department of General Surgery at GMC Baramulla has made a significant breakthrough in the field of colorectal cancer surgery by performing its maiden laparoscopic-assisted Low Anterior Resection on a 65-year-old female with Adenocarcinoma of the rectum.

The surgery, which is an advanced minimal access procedure, officials said, is only performed in a few tertiary care hospitals in J&K, making this a noteworthy achievement for the department.

The officials said that the patient is recovering well in the postoperative period, and the expenses of the surgery were covered under PMJAY.

"Despite the limitations faced by an institution in its infancy, the Department of General Surgery is making all efforts to offer regular oncology services to the public," Dr Parvaiz Masoodi, Medical Superintendent of the hospital

He said such surgeries are routinely being carried out at the hospital and has got the necessary expertise and the equipment for the conduct of the surgeries which are not only complex but also require a lot of expertise.

"We have planned that we will be carrying out such surgeries here given the fact that we have got the requirements. The anaesthesia team was led by Dr Fayaz Munshi and Dr Tahira, and the officials said that they deserve accolades for making the surgery possible.

Along with the OT technicians who provided all the help, Dr Zaffar Kawoosa, the gastroenterologist, has also played a vital role and ensured the timely referral of the patient.

"Overall, this case showcases the dedication and expertise of the medical professionals at GMC Baramulla," the officials said.

# 2 held with 20 grams heroin

JAMMU, Mar 15: Two drug peddlers were arrested by police in Jammu's Jourian area and 20 grams of heroin was recovered from their possession, a police official said.

He said that 15 grams of heroin was recovered from one Mohammad Yousef of Datriyal Village in Marh Tehsil of Jammu District and 5 grams of heroin was recovered from one Raj Kumar of Jourian at a surprise naka established at Garhi Village of Jourian area.

"The accused have been booked in case FIR number 88/2023 under sections 8/21/22/29 of the NDPS Act registered at Police Station Akhnoor and further investigation taken up," said the police official.

Pertinently, the arrest and seizure was made by a team of Police Post Jourian led by SDPO Akhnoor Mohan Lal assisted by SHO Akhnoor Inspector Harjeet Singh and incharge Police Post Jourian PSI Karnail Singh.

# 7 vehicles involved in illegal mining seized

KATHUA, Mar 15: Joint operation team of the Mining Department and Kathua Police headed by District Mineral Officer, Rajinder Singh today seized seven more vehicles involved in illegal mining at Nagri and Billawar areas.

Continuing with massive operations underway for the last one week, DMO along with Kathua police have turned tuff towards mining mafia and violators who deal with illegal business of mining material.

The DMO informed that no vehicle can transport raw or finished mineral from Nallah, rivers, stone crushers and other mining places without valid documents and for transportation such material from one place to another, approved e-challans are required.

All the seven seized vehicles were handed over to concerned police posts for further legal action as per the extant rules by the Mining Department.

# LS adjourned for day

NEW DELHI, Mar 15:

Lok Sabha proceedings were adjourned for the day today Wednesday amid slogan shouting by opposition and treasury benches over Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's "democracy under attack" remark made in the UK.

As soon as the House assembled, opposition members stormed into the well holding placards and shouting slogans. They demanded a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) probe into the alleged stock manipulation by the Adani Group.

Members of the treasury benches also raised counter slogans, demanding an apology from Gandhi for his remarks made during an event in the UK. Gandhi had alleged that the structures of Indian democracy are under attack and there is a "full-scale assault" on the country's institutions.

The remarks have triggered a political slugfest. The BJP has accused Gandhi of maligning India on foreign soil and seeking foreign interventions, while the Congress has hit back at the ruling party by citing instances of Prime Minister Narendra Modi raising internal politics abroad.

House proceedings have remained disrupted since resuming for the second leg of the budget session on Monday.

Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla today repeatedly urged the members to return to their seats and allow the House to run.

"This House is meant for holding discussions and dialogues. Let's talk about policy and a have good discussion on issues related to public welfare. If we want people's welfare and consider this house a temple of democracy, I will request that at least don't comment on this house," Birla said.

"It is not right to comment, either inside (the house) or outside (the house) in democracy," he added.

As the members refused to relent, the speaker initially adjourned the house till 2 pm. When the house resumed, the sloganeering continued even as Bhartruhari Mahtab, who was in the chair, kept requesting for

order.

"It is not the sole responsibility of the chair to maintain order in this house. It is the responsibility of every member," Mahtab said.

He also said that while papers were allowed in the house, placards weren't.

Amid the ruckus, The Inter-Services (Command, Control and Discipline) Bill, 2023 was introduced in the house by Minister of State for Defence Ajay Bhatt.

Slogans such as "Rahul Gandhi sadan me aao (Rahul Gandhi come to Parliament)" were raised as Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi sought an apology from Gandhi. Joshi said instead of apologising, the Congress party was bringing placards to the house.

"I am getting calls from the diaspora that Rahul Gandhi insulted the country. He has spoken against the speaker. He has levelled allegations against institutions. India is a sovereign country and asking other countries to intervene is an insult," he said.

Seconds after the statement made by the minister, the chair adjourned the house for the day. (PTI)

# Cop ends life in Anantnag

SRINAGAR, Mar 15: A policeman ended his life by allegedly shooting himself dead with his service rifle in the Hiller area of Anantnag district today.

A police official said that the selection grade constable of IRP 18 Battalion Umar Farooq of Poonch shot dead himself at Hillar camp this evening.

He was immediately shifted to GMC Anantnag, where doctors declared him dead.

The reason behind suicide couldn't be immediately confirmed and investigation has been started.

# 4 women hurt as speeding bike hits

POONCH, Mar 15: Four women were injured after they were hit by a speeding bike in Mendhar town of district Poonch today.

Sources said that four women were badly injured when a speeding bike hit them in front of the main gate of Jama Masjid in main market, Mendhar town on Wednesday. The mishap took place when the bike went out of control after stunt by the rider. He escaped from the spot after hitting the women in busy market. The people and the police took the injured women to the local hospital in an ambulance.

The injured have been identified as Begum Bi (68), wife of Mohd Sharif, resident of Kasbladi; Resham Bi (65), wife of Lal Hussain, resident of Ari, Naseema Bi (55), wife of Mohd Sadiq, residence of Gani and Shaheen Akhtar (50), wife of Mohd Jameel, a resident of Ari village in Mendhar.

Block Medical Officer Mendhar, Dr Parvez Ahmad Khan said that the injured women are being treated at Mendhar Sub-District Hospital and their condition is stable. A case has been registered in Mendhar Police Station in this connection.

KATHUA, Mar 15: The Press Club Kathua, president Sanjay Pathak's mother, Taro Devi, wife of late Om Parkesh breathed her last this evening at her WNo 4 residence Kathua. Her cremation will be held at 12 pm, at ITI road Cremation Ground, Kathua, tomorrow. The journalist fraternity of Kathua has condoned the sad demise of Pathak's mother and prayed for peace to departed soul.

# Burglary case solved in Baramulla; 2 arrested

SRINAGAR, Mar 15: Police in Baramulla today said to have solved a burglary case by arresting 2 accused persons involved in the commission of crime and recovered stolen property from their possession.

Police Post Mirgund received a complaint from one person named Harjeet Singh (Project Manager A-Z Services) stating therein that during intervening night of 13 and 14 March-2023, some unknown burglars broke the lock of the storeroom and stole high-tension transmission line and red material 33000 KV element.

Accordingly, police said, a case under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Pattan and investigation was initiated.

During investigation, with the help of technical and human resources names of some suspects surfaced. Among the suspects, Fida Hussain Khanday, son of Ghulam Mohammad Khanday, resident of Yekhmanpora was called for questioning.

"During questioning, he confessed that he alongwith two other accomplices namely Shahin Ahmed Taknoo son of Gh Ahmad Taknoo resident of Zaalpora Sumbal and Aijaz Ahmad Malla, son of Gh Mohammad Malla, resident of Yekhmanpora are involved in the commission of crime," police said.

Among the involved persons, two have been arrested while the third accused person named Aijaz Ahmad Malla is still at large and efforts are on to nab him.

On their disclosure, police said, stolen materials worth lakhs were recovered. "Moreover, the vehicle (Load Carrier) bearing registration number JK15B-4178 used in the commission of crime has also been seized.

# Rain, hail-storm in Jammu areas

JAMMU, Mar 15: Rain, hail storm and strong winds affected normal life in many areas of Jammu region this evening.

The rain brought the temperature in the winter capital city considerably below as compared to the last couple of days. The people again wore some woolen clothes this evening with fall in temperature, which they had stopped wearing after Holi.

The dark clouds, with thunder-storm were seen hovering over the sky in Jammu during this evening. It was followed by heavy rain for some time. It led to water logging at several low lying city areas and crossings.

Reports from hilly areas of Udhampur, Reasi, Katra, Jammu and parts of Kathua said that heavy downpour with light hail-

storm at several places was witnessed during afternoon and evening. It also cause damage to fruit trees and vegetables crop. The reports of strong winds in parts of Udhampur, Ramban and Kathua were also received, however, no major loss of property was reported.

The staff of PHC Latti and BMO, Dr Yassar also joined the team.

Sarpanch Latti Kasturi Lal Gupta inaugurated the camp in presence of Medical staff and Tehsildar Latti Paramdeep Singh. Over a score of villagers and government officials donated blood. Due to heavy rain in the area today, the process was disrupted.

# Migrants living in Nagrota, Jagti lack basic amenities: Wanchoo

JAMMU, May 15: BJYM State media in charge and Prabhari Kashmir Displaced District (KDD), Chetan Wanchoo today said the migrants living in Nagrota TRT and Jagti township lack basic amenities and have been craving for attention.

Wanchoo visited the TRT camp, Nagrota and Jagti township to take stock of the problems being faced by the Kashmiri Pandits putting up there. District president BJYM, KDD, Rohit Gangoo and Mandal president, BJYM KDD, Vatsal Bhan was also present.

He said the condition of these quarters is worst as the "The roof tops and walls of these buildings developed cracks and leakages which were not being repaired by the concerned department. Inmates at several occasions brought the problems into the notice of men at helms but to no avail and they continued to suffer each passing year," he added.

Besides, Wanchoo asserted that the Kashmiri migrants are lack healthcare facilities. He said there is dire need to improve facilities at Sub District Hospital Jagti and Nagrota TRT which is catering to the needs of displaced Kashmiri Pandits and residents living in the vicinity.

He said that the KPs which are living in the vicinity since last over three decades are totally dependent on this hospital but the poor infrastructure and handful of facilities are forcing them to look for the same in other places. He said even there was no ambulance available at TRT to shift a patient to Jammu in case of any emergency.

Wanchoo said that there was huge shortage of drinking water in the camps. Despite taking up the matter with the authorities concerned no steps have been taken to address their issues. He sought immediate intervention of Lt Governor in redressing the problems of the camp inmates.

# Implement R R Plan for Rattle, other power projects: Shan

JAMMU, Mar 15: Tilak Shan president Chenab Valley, Shiv Sena urged Lt.Governor JKUT to issues directives to authorities of Jammu and Kashmir State Power Development Corporation Ltd (JKSPDCL) to implement the Relief and Rehabilitation (RR) Plan of district Kishtwar where various new power projects are under construction.

Besides, Shan urged Lt. Governor to take a strong note on District Administration regarding its delay in implementation of RR Plan so that beneficiaries should not suffer
