Sinha said 70 per cent of the population of Jammu and Kashmir is connected with agriculture and allied sectors and during the next five years, additional budget allocation of Rs 5,013 crore will be infused in this sector.

"Security is a priority and so are other focus areas such as tourism, youth empowerment and education," he added.

Earlier addressing the gathering,

the Lieutenant Governor called upon higher education institutions to promote sports as a core subject.

"It is a powerful medium to ensure physical-emotional health, enhances learning efficiency and helps in character building," he said.

He said sports nurture both mind and body and enables students to become well-rounded across disciplines.

"National Education Policy has given us an opportunity to promote sports through a multidisciplinary system and end fragmentation in the education system," he said.

Citing various reports and studies on the impact of sports on the mind of an individual, the Lt Governor said the researchers considered Sports as a miracle for the brain. It is important that sports should be a part of our curriculum, he noted.

Highlighting the initiatives taken for holistic development of youth, Sinha said under the guidance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the National Education Policy is creating a progressive ecosystem for the students to translate their dreams into reality.

Speaking to reporters after a passing out parade of fresh recruits at the BSF's Subsidiary Training Centres (STC) Kashmir here, Sastry said the BSF is alert and will be successful in foiling any misadventure against the country's security.

He said border guarding is a very important role for any country's internal security and the force has been playing this role very successfully.

"The BSF has been playing a very important role since 1965 and has been successful in meeting all the challenges," he added.

"This respect has become focal point of world attention," the Chief Justice said and added strong position of the country was visible during ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict.

Congratulating the award winners, Justice Kotsiwar Singh hoped that they will strive to bring more awards in future and, at the same time, other journalists too would continue to work hard. He applauded Prof RK Chhibber Memorial Trust for recognizing hard work of journalists and establishing the awards.

"The Press Club of Jammu also deserves credit for partnering with the Trust for such prestigious awards so that journalists have an incentive to work hard and also with a spirit of competition," he said, adding India has a rich culture of a vibrant and free press.

Justice Kotsiwar Singh said media is a vital organ and has since independence played an extremely crucial role in sustaining and strengthening democracy.

"Journalists continue to perform their role in a stellar manner. They continue to speak truth," he asserted.

The Chief Justice said while electronic and social media are growing, the print media continue to play very significant role in chronicling the Indian development story especially since it can't afford to go wrong on facts.

### NIA conducts searches in J&K

militant handlers.

A spokesperson of the agency said that in June 2022, the NIA had registered a suo-moto case against Over Ground Workers and cadres of various proscribed outfits and their off-shoots, which were operating under pseudo names on the commands of their Pakistani commanders or handlers.

"In follow up operations in 2022, searches were conducted at 14 locations in six districts of Jammu and Kashmir including Srinagar, Baramulla, Pulwama, Anantnag, Budgam and Kathua and one location in Fatehgarh Sahib in Punjab," the spokesperson added.

The official said digital devices and incriminating material were seized from these locations during the raids that were conducted yesterday while further investigations are in progress.

The official said the case relates to a militant conspiracy hatched by Pakistan-based commanders of proscribed terrorist organisations to radicalize the youth of Jammu and Kashmir and target members of minority communities, security personnel and religious events or activities.

"The accused were also found involved in spreading terror in Jammu and Kashmir over cyberspace," the spokesperson said, adding during investigations, 12 suspects were identified who were in touch with different Pakistan based handlers.

"Searches were conducted at different locations belonging to the suspects across J&K and Punjab," the spokesperson said.

### J&K gets 20 more DNB seats

by National Board of Examinations in Medical Science (NBEMS) under DNB for the institutions of J&K during the start of the Session 2023. These seats shall be in addition to the earlier granted DNB seats.

While Government Medical College (GMC) Srinagar received approval of 2 seats in FNB Paediatric Anaesthesia, JLN Hospital Srinagar got 3 Post MBBS DNB seats in General Surgery and District Hospital (DH) Udhampur was given a sanction of 5 seats under Pediatrics, General Medicine and Orthopedics.

DH Poonch received 2 seats in General Medicine, DH Ganderbal 2 seats each in DNB General Medicine and Diploma Pediatrics whereas DH Kulgam got 2 seats in Family Medicine and CHC Kupwara received 2 seats in Diploma Pediatrics.

Ayushi Sudan (Mission Director, NHM J&K), while giving details about the development, said that implementation of the DNB courses at the district level in J&K has been termed as a best practice in the country. She said that under DNB programme in the UT, a total of 250 seats were granted to the accredited departments during Session 2022 consequent to the concerted efforts and hard work of the Administrative Department, Health and Medical

Education (H&ME) Department J&K, NHM J&K and the team of health institutions being monitored by Bhupinder Kumar (Secretary, H&ME Department).

Sudan said that all the efforts are being made to scale up the DNB courses in all the District Hospitals and potential Community Health Centres (CHCs) of J&K. During upcoming session, she said, J&K is planning to submit more than 30 applications for DNB seats for almost all District Hospitals.

"Implementation of DNB courses has led to an equitable distribution of health care services and manpower especially in far flung and hard to reach areas and beneficial to the population which have very meager access to health care services in their areas, leading to low referrals from DNB institutions to Tertiary Care institutions thereby further decreasing the out of pocket expenditure of the patients," the MD NHM J&K added.

Pertinent to mention that the DNB courses have been introduced in the District Hospitals and new Government Medical Colleges besides old GMCs and SKIMS in order to strengthen the institutions, decongest the Government Medical Colleges and to address the shortage of specialists in the UT of J&K.

### India invites Pakistan Defence Minister for SCO meet

NEW DELHI, Mar 15: India has invited Pakistan Defence Minister Khawaja Asif for a meeting of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) next month along with his counterparts from other member nations of the grouping, people familiar with the development said on Wednesday.

The invite to Asif for the April 28 meeting was sent by India in its capacity as current chair of the eight-nation SCO, weeks after a similar communication was sent to Islamabad inviting Pakistan Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari for a foreign ministerial

conclave of the grouping that is scheduled to be held in May.

"The invites to ministers and officials concerned of the SCO member nations for respective meetings are being sent as part of laid down norms," one of the people cited above said.

They said Pakistan defence minister Asif was sent an invitation through the Indian High Commission in Islamabad for the defence ministerial meeting.

India is also set to send separate invites to Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, Chinese President Xi Jinping and Russian President Vladimir Putin for the annual SCO summit later this year. (PTI)

The former CM said that the youth from outside J&K are not enemies, but the fact is the children here (in J&K) cannot compete with them given the ability. "The children, hailing from outside, use to speak in English soon after they take birth,

locals only," he said.

Azad further said that the recent demolition drive by the Government would have made 70 lakh people across J&K homeless. "It is the time for J&K people to decide about their future and extend their support to BJP or their own people," he said.

He added that the people are not being even allowed to utter anything, but this situation will be changed shortly if they are elected to power.
