fixed as 2026. However, it has now been advanced to 2024.

"The Road, Transport and Highways Ministry is constructing nine tunnels between Jammu and Kashmir," Gadhkari said, adding that Z-Morh tunnel in Sonamarg will be inaugurated in April.

The Union Minister is likely to inaugurate the tunnel on April 10 during his visit to Ladakh.

The 6.5 km Z-Morh tunnel between Gagangir and Sonamarg on the Srinagar-Leh highway will provide connectivity round-the-year.

"We are also building Asia's longest tunnel at Zojila. 65-70 per cent of work on the Zojila tunnel has been completed and it will be inaugurated in 2024," Gadhkari said.

The 13.5-km Zojila tunnel, being built for Rs 4,900 crore, when ready, will play a key role in making the road (NH1) connecting Srinagar with Leh an all-weather one.

The original deadline for the 11,000-foot high project is December 2026.

At present, the road remains closed for vehicular traffic after the winter sets in as the area sees heavy snowfall.

In his address, Union Home Minister Amit Shah also said that India would become a USD five trillion economy by 2025.

He also expressed confidence that by December 2023, the 5G roll-out will be fully completed across

the country.

Shah spoke about logistics costs in India and reiterated how the Government is trying to reduce them to 7.5 per cent from 13 per cent by 2028.

Speaking about India's massive digital payments ecosystem, he said UPI-based payments are accepted even by a street-side vendor.

The Home Minister said that today over 50 per cent of the total digital transactions in the country are done through UPI mode.

"When Prime Minister Narendra Modi had launched digital transaction, former Finance Minister P Chidambaram had criticized that how a vegetable seller would take money online... Today, people even in remotest villages of India make digital transactions," he said.

"The growth in digital payments was possible due to large internet networks and power supply in rural areas," Shah said.

"Our all-embracing and all-inclusive schemes have led to the multifaceted development of India. And today the world is surprised by our achievements," he added.

"In a vast country like India, the development of the country can be achieved only by following the 'Whole of Government' approach... and Prime Minister Narendra Modi has implemented this vision of Team India on the ground, and which is why such good results have come in the past nine years," he said.

**Nearly 10 lakh drug addicts in J&K: Central Ministry**

Addicts, which not only provide treatment to the drug victims but also give services of preventive education, awareness generation, motivational counseling, detoxification/de-addiction, after care and re-integration into the social mainstream.

However, out of 340 Integrated Rehabilitation Centres for Addicts established in the country only one is running in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

Likewise, Community-based Peer Led Intervention (CPLI) Centres are supported by the Ministry and these CPLIs focus on vulnerable and at risk children and adolescents. Under this, peer educators engage children for awareness generation and life skill activities. However, out of 40 CPLIs established till date, two are running in the UT of J&K.

There are three Outreach and Drop in Centres (ODICs) in UT of J&K out of total 71 established by the Ministry to provide safe and secure space of treatment and rehabilitation for substance users with provision of screening, assessment and counseling and thereafter provide referral and linkage to treatment and rehabilitation services for substance dependence, the Ministry said.

The Government also supports setting up of District De-addiction Centres (DDACs) in those districts across the country where there is no IRCA, ODIC and CPLI centres. Currently, 15 DDACs are supported by the Ministry out of which there are five in Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

Meanwhile, Ministry of Home Affairs, in reply to a question regarding menace of narcotics, informed the Lok Sabha that Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) has destroyed poppy on 288 acres of land in J&K in 2018, 1123 acres in 2019, 893 acres in 2020, 292 acres in 2021 and only 88 acres in 2020.

These figures clearly that no major progress has been made in destruction of poppy, which is grown on major chunk of land particularly in Kashmir valley. Rather, the figure vis-à-vis destruction of poppy has witnessed decline during the past few years.

The figures relating to destruction of cannabis show increase in activities of NCB but keeping in huge chunk of land being used for growing of cannabis in Kashmir valley the performance is not up to the satisfaction. In 2018, cannabis was destroyed on 37 acres of land, 295 acres in 2020, 523 acres in 2021 and 443 acres in 2022.

According to him, under the Rs 245 crore Special Development Package (SDP) announced for Ladakh, focus has been laid specifically on improving the infrastructure in the Eastern border region "and these initiatives have been benefitting the nomads and the herders to a larger extent".

Apart from this, Yakzee said, "Vibrant Village Programme (VVP) aimed at strengthening the infrastructure in the region has also been benefitting the herding community largely."

**Those involved in corruption coming on one platform : PM**

Under the Congress rule, banks were "looted" and people accused of siphoning off Rs 22,000 crore fled abroad, he said, adding his Government has seized their assets worth Rs 20,000 crore.

The CBI has registered more than 5,000 cases under corruption charges under his Government and hundreds of senior officials facing graft allegations were forcibly retired and are facing lawful action, Modi said.

Corruption has harmed the country a great deal and hollowed it out like termites, he said, adding that people realise that the country will progress only when graft is contained.

People, Modi asserted, are applauding his Government's campaign against corruption and tell him wherever he goes, "Don't stop Modi ji".

Taking a swipe at the Opposition for its campaign against the BJP and him, he said senior Congress leaders used to talk about rooting out the Jana Sangh once and now the main opposition party is talking about digging his grave.

The BJP is a party which sacrificed itself to save democracy, he said, referring to the merger of the Jana Sangh, its earlier avatar, with other parties after the Emergency.

In a reference to the probe into 2002 Gujarat riots when he was the State's Chief Minister, Modi said many conspiracies were hatched to send him to jail but they all failed miserably while he flourished due to people's blessings.

In his speech, the Prime Minister dwelt on the BJP's growth from having two Lok Sabha seats in 1984 to 303 in 2019. In an apparent reference to the anti-Sikh violence following the Prime Minister Indira Gandhi's assassination, he said it was a black chapter that the country will not be able to forget.

The Congress won a historic mandate in an emotionally-charged polls while the BJP was almost destroyed but it did not lose hope and blame others. It continued to work among people and strengthened its organisation.

The BJP has now emerged as the only pan-India party amidst family-run political parties in the country as it worked on the ground with people braving all odds.

"BJP started its journey from just two Lok Sabha seats and reached 303 in 2019. In many of the states, we got more than 50 per cent votes," he said.

"From north to south and from east to west, the BJP is the only pan-India party today," he added.

The BJP has emerged as not only the world's biggest but also the most futuristic party, he said, adding that its only goal is to make a modern and developed India.

The party is expanding in south India, he said, adding that it is the number one party in Karnataka and is the only reliable force in Telangana. It is growing in Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Kerala, he said.

"The people of the northeast have shown unprecedented faith in the BJP. It has four chief ministers there and is part of Coalition Governments in two other States," he said.

**J&K revenue receipts rise but fall short of estimates: CAG**

which resulted in reduction of revenue deficit to Rs 31 crore from Rs 138 crore the year before.

"The increase in capital expenditure by Rs 589 crore was major contributor in increase of fiscal deficit. The government could not keep its fiscal deficit and primary deficit within the projections estimated in the budget. Against projection of revenue surplus of Rs 28,337 crore in budget there was revenue deficit of Rs 31 crore during 2021-22," the report stated.

It said Rs 42,690.77 crore grants-in-aid from the central government constituted 72.07 per cent of the total revenue receipts of Rs 59,238.50 crore for 2021-22.

The total committed expenditure accounted for 75.93 per cent of revenue expenditure during 2021-22, the report said.

It said there was revenue deficit of Rs 30.83 crore in the accounts of Jammu and Kashmir for the year 2021-22 which was understated by Rs 200.29 crore due to misclassification of revenue expenditure as capital expenditure, non-payment of interest on state compensatory afforestation fund and deposit.

"There was fiscal deficit of Rs 11,150.61 crore during 2021-22 which was understated by Rs 41.53 crore due to non-payment of interest on state compensatory afforestation fund and state compensatory afforestation deposit," it said.

Red flagging poor loan recovery, the CAG said that during 2021-22, the Jammu and Kashmir government disbursed loans and advances of Rs 73.77 crore and recovered loans and advances amounting to Rs 1.03 crore.

"Out of total loans disbursed during 2021-22, loans amounting Rs 40 crore was disbursed to J&K Road Transport Corporation (JKRTC) Limited which already had outstanding loans of Rs

**EPFO raises interest to 8.15 pc**

cent for its subscribers, from 8.5 per cent in 2020-21.

This was the lowest since 1977-78, when the EPF interest rate stood at 8 per cent.

The apex decision making body of EPFO, Central Board Trustees (CBT) headed by Union Labour Minister Bhupendra Yadav, recommended 8.15 per cent annual rate of interest to be credited on EPF accumulations in members' accounts for financial year 2022-23, a Labour Ministry statement said.

The interest rate would be officially notified in the Government gazette after approval of Ministry of Finance, following which EPFO would credit the rate of interest into subscribers' accounts, it said.

The recommended rate of interest of 8.15 per cent safeguards the surplus as well as guarantees increased income to members, it stated adding that in fact, this rate of interest and the surplus of Rs 663.91 crore are higher than the last year's.

According to EPFO's income projection, the body would have had a surplus of Rs 112.78 crore on providing 8.20 per cent interest rate on EPF for 2022-23. There would have been a deficit of Rs 438.34 crore on providing 8.25 per cent rate of interest.

The Ministry said the board's recommendation involves distribution of more than Rs 90,000 crore in the members' account on total principal amount of Rs 11 lakh crore which was Rs 77,424.84 crore

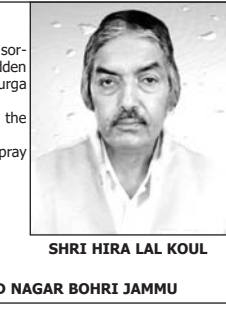
