Live telecast of Aarti at Shiv Khori Shrine remains a distant dream

"However, no positive result came out of discussion and this can be gauged from the fact that in the Board meeting of the Shrine Board held in the month of November last year, the Divisional Commissioner, who is also Chairman of the Board, directed the Deputy Commissioner Reasi to establish contact with the live broadcast channel and re-start the live Aarti. Moreover, he asked the Deputy Commissioner to ensure the Aarti live telecast timings don't clash with the live Aarti of Shri MataVaishno Devi for convenience of viewers (devotees)," sources said.

They further said, "despite all this live telecast of Aarti at Shiv Khori Shrine has not started till date as tender floated by Shrine Board evoked poor response from the television channels and now it has been decided to float the tender once again", adding "unless the Board makes some additional efforts apart from floating the tenders the much-needed live telecast of Aarti is not going to become reality".

An officer of the Board, when contacted, confirmed that there was no expected response to the tender floated for the live telecast of Aarti, adding "MH One Channel, which telecast Aarti at Shri

Mata Vaishnodevi Shrine, is not ready to facilitate us free of cost and some sort of benefit is required to be provided to the channel".

"In the next meeting of the Shrine Board this issue will be debated and hopefully some concrete decision will be taken so that live telecast of Aarti becomes reality", he said while wishing anonymity.

Not only this, the Shrine Board has even failed to take any concrete steps for preparation of Master Plan for Shri Shiv Khori Shrine on the lines of Shri Mata Vaishnodevi Shrine despite being aware of the fact that such a plan is imperative for holistic and planned development of entire shrine area in future, sources said.

In the last Board meeting, Divisional Commissioner too had laid stress on preparation of Master Plan including development of facilities for pilgrims and works to be taken up in future for overall development of shrine and upgradation of facilities.

"It is a fact that exercise in this regard is yet to be started but the Board is very serious on this aspect and shortly some agency or reputed institution of the country will be engaged for preparation of Master Plan", officer of the Shrine Board said.

Second blast near Golden Temple in 30 hours, one hurt

stepped up in the area.

Speaking to reporters here, DGP Yadav, who visited the spot, said one person was injured in the explosion which was reported around 6:15 am.

The explosive was very crudely made and assembled. Though no shrapnel was used, there was a loud sound, he said.

The officer said the two explosions in the area are being "scientifically investigated".

"Our forensic team is present on the spot," he said. "We have not found any triggering device or any detonator," he said referring to the two incidents.

The absence of a triggering mechanism means it is a crude device. It appears that the explosive was kept in a container, Yadav said on Monday's blast.

"At this moment, we are not ruling out anything... It could be someone's mischief, but it is too early to say whether it is a mischief, or there is a terror angle to it," he said.

The DGP said CCTV footage is being scanned and details are

being sought from eyewitnesses.

"I want to assure the people that everything is normal and we will maintain peace and harmony. People should not lend an ear to any rumours. Punjab Police is there to keep the State safe and secure," he said.

Amritsar Police Commissioner Naunihal Singh said a case has been registered in connection with the two blasts, which took place in a span of nearly 30 hours.

"We have stepped up security in the area," he said.

The spot where the explosion took place has been cordoned off.

The heritage street leading to the Golden Temple witnesses heavy footfall every day. Thousands of devotees walk through the street, dotted with shops and food joints, to reach the Golden Temple.

Jasbir Singh Patti, a daily visitor to the Golden Temple for the last 20 years, said the explosions have created panic among the devotees and the police should thoroughly investigate these incidents.

One person was injured and glass facades of some buildings were damaged in the blast on May 6. (PTI)

tion, they said, the twin organizations—Leh Apex Body (LAB) and Kargil Democratic Alliance (KDA) which are demanding Statehood, Sixth Schedule status, two Parliamentary seats and employment opportunities for Ladakh, have dissociated themselves from the HPC.

The LAB and KDA want members from their bodies to be included in the HPC as per their choice besides incorporation of their agenda. They have already sent letters to the MHA mentioning names from their bodies who should be part of the HPC as well as agenda items for discussion including Sixth Schedule status, Statehood to Ladakh, two Parliamentary seats and job opportunities.

When approached for comments on delay in initiation of talks between the Union Home Ministry and representatives of Ladakh, senior BJP leader and lone Member of Parliament from the Union Territory Jammu and Kashmir said Narendra Modi Government including Home Minister Amit Shah have done a lot for the Union Territory of Ladakh.

"A decision on extending safeguards to Ladakh is our demand," Namgoyal said.

Asked how it will be done, the Ladakh MP said it is for the Central Government to take a decision but whatever done will be in the interest of Ladakhis just like Narendra Modi fulfilled years-old demand of the people of Ladakh for Union Territory status.

"The HPC has been constituted and all issues of Ladakh are being constantly monitored by the Prime Minister and the Home Minister," the MP Ladakh said.

30 nomadic families with livestock, 10 tourists stranded in snow rescued

Top in the Anantnag district today.

He said that the adverse weather conditions, including heavy rainfall in the plains and snowfall in the higher reaches of Kashmir, had caused the families to become trapped for the past 24 hours.

He said that the prompt response from the Army, along with the Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM) Kokernag and the civil administration, led to a swift rescue operation. Army vehicles equipped with snow chains were deployed to assist in the rescue of the families and their livestock.

"Most of the rescued families hailed from Reasi and Pathribal. To provide additional support, 19 Rashtriya Rifles (RR) established a medical camp at the Gawran base, ensuring specialized treatment for the rescued individuals. The Civil Administration, including the Station House Officer (SHO) Larnoo, extended necessary assistance to the families at the Gawran base," the official said.

"Medical aid for the livestock was also provided by a team of doctors from the Animal Husbandry Department. Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM) Kokernag, in an interview with Kashmir Independent Media Service (KIMS Kashmir), reported the successful rescue of approximately 75 people and around 1500 livestock, safely bringing them down to Gawran. The rescued individuals are currently receiving medical care, food, shelter, and other necessary support from the Administration, Police, Army, CRPF, and other involved parties," the official added.

There were heavy rains in Kashmir especially south of Srinagar with higher reaches of Kulgam, Tulai Gurez, Gulmarg and others experienced fresh snowfall since last evening.

"The IAF regrets the loss of lives and offers its deepest condolences to the bereaved families. A Court of Inquiry has been constituted to ascertain the cause of the accident," it said.

Panama Papers: ED seizes over Rs 41-cr valued prime real estate of Zavareh Poonawalla

NEW DELHI, May 8:

Dubbed the 'Panama Papers', an investigation of a stockpile of records from Panamanian legal firm Mossack Fonseca by Washington-based International Consortium of Investigative Journalists (ICIJ) in 2016 had named several world leaders and celebrities who allegedly stashed away money abroad in offshore companies.

Investigators have said not all people whose name figured in this list were offenders.

The ED found that funds remitted by Zavareh Poonawalla and his family members were utilised by Stallast Limited to "purchase" four apartments in the Paddington area of central London. Multiple FEMA contraventions were seen in these transactions, it alleged.

The ED said besides "mis-declarations" in remittances, Zavareh Poonawalla and his family members also "wrongly" claimed these investments as foreign portfolio investments. In reality, the foreign entity was completely controlled by them and thus, they did overseas direct investment in a foreign wholly owned subsidiary without due permission of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), the agency said.

The foreign assets were not declared to the RBI, and they continued to hold the foreign assets and are in continuous enjoyment of the same, it alleged.

"The properties abroad were acquired through the funds remitted under LRS to avoid reporting requirements to RBI and thus, (Zavareh) Poonawalla mis-utilised the LRS," the ED said. "Therefore, the equivalent value of properties held by them in India have been seized under the provisions of Section 37A of the FEMA," it said. (PTI)

Govt bans apple imports if its price is less than Rs 50 per Kg

NEW DELHI, May 8:

The Government on Monday banned the import of apples if its imported price is less than Rs 50 per Kg.

The Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) said in a notification that the imports are free if the price is above Rs 50 per kg.

"Import of apples...Is prohibited wherever the CIF (cost, insurance, freight) import price is less than equal to Rs 50 per Kg," DGFT said in the notification.

The minimum import price condition shall not be applicable for imports from Bhutan, it added.

In 2023, India imported apples worth USD 296 million against USD 385.1 million in 2022.

The main countries which export apples to India include the US, Iran, Brazil, UAE, Afghanistan, France, Belgium, Chile, Italy, Turkey, New Zealand, South Africa and Poland. Imports from South Africa rose 84.8 per cent to USD 18.53 million during April-February 2022-23.

Similarly from Poland, the inbound shipments of apple increased by 83.36 per cent to USD 15.39 million. However, imports declined from countries like the US, UAE, France and Afghanistan. (PTI)

'We will take Ayodhya to highest peak of development': Adityanath

BARABANKI/MIRZAPUR/AYODHYA (UP), May 8:

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Monday targeted the Samajwadi Party, saying the wrong message would go out if those who opened fire at 'kar sevaks' get votes in Ayodhya.

Addressing an election rally for the BJP's mayoral candidate Girish Pati Tripathi in Ayodhya, Adityanath referred to the incidents of firing on 'kar sevaks' in 1990, when the Samajwadi Party (SP) led by Mulayam Singh Yadav was in power, and said "a bad message would go out if those who fired at Ram devotees get votes".

Adityanath also addressed public meetings of the BJP's mayoral candidates in Barabanki and Mirzapur. The second phase of elections to urban local bodies in Uttar Pradesh will be held on Thursday. The counting of votes will be taken up on Saturday.

"Any devotee of Ram emerging victorious in Ayodhya in this festival of democracy will create a good impression. But if the person who fired at the devotees of Ram gets votes, it (will) send the wrong message..." the chief minister said.

In 1990, the Uttar Pradesh Police opened fire on 'kar sevaks' who had come to take part in the Ram temple movement in Ayodhya.

Promising development for Ayodhya, Adityanath said, "We will take Ayodhya to the highest peak of development. The eyes of the country and the world are on Ayodhya and so it is necessary to constitute a strong municipal board for all-

round development. When a strong board is constituted, development will be rapid."

He said more than a crore devotees will visit Ayodhya once the grand temple of Lord Ram is completed in January.

"The better, more beautiful and cleaner Ayodhya is, the better the impression about Sanatan Dharma, revered saints, places of pilgrimage and India will go out to the country and the world," he stressed.

Earlier in Barabanki, Adityanath accused the opposition parties, including the SP and the Congress, of dividing the society on the basis of caste by pursuing the policy of "appeasement".

He said the BJP did not allow appeasement to flourish but focused on the empowerment of the people.

"The people of the SP, Bahujan Samaj Party and the Congress used to divide the society on the basis of caste by following the policy of appeasement. Not only this, a particular family used to be given permission to loot (people). Today, with the spirit of 'sabka saath, sabka vikaas', the benefits of the schemes are reaching people without discrimination," Adityanath said.

"We did not allow appeasement to flourish, but focused on the empowerment of the society and today its results are coming to the fore," he added.

He said when the country became independent in 1947, not many people could celebrate the occasion.

"But today, every Indian joined together to celebrate the Amrit Mahotsav of independence under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi," he said. (PTI)

Jalandhar bypoll: Security tightened across State

CHANDIGARH, May 8:

Security has been tightened across Punjab ahead of the Jalandhar Lok Sabha bypoll on Wednesday to ensure a free, fair and peaceful election, police said on Monday.

Director General of Police (Law and Order) Arpit Shukla said commissioners of police and senior Superintendents of police have been directed to install special "nakas" (check-points) and enhance patrolling across the state to keep a vigil on anti-social elements in their respective jurisdictions.

"Similarly, SSPs of border districts have been asked to seal the borders by installing interstate nakas and not to let anyone enter the state without thorough checking and frisking," he added in a statement.

Shukla said apart from enhancing patrolling, the Punjab Police personnel, along with paramilitary forces, have been carrying out regular flag marches, especially in the vulnerable areas, as part of confidence-building measures.

Indian prisoner dies in Karachi; Pakistan to release 199 Indian fishermen on May 12

KARACHI, May 8:

Pakistani authorities are expected to go ahead with its goodwill gesture to release on Friday 199 Indian fishermen arrested for allegedly fishing illegally in the country's waters, despite the death of an Indian civilian who was to be repatriated with them.

Kazi Nazir, a top police official in the jail and corrections department in Sindh, said that they had been told by relevant government ministries to prepare for the release and repatriation of 199 fishermen on Friday. These fishermen will be sent to Lahore and handed over to Indian authorities at the Wagah border. Currently, these fishermen are lodged at the Landhi jail here.

He said the goodwill gesture process appeared on the course although an Indian civilian prisoner, Zulfiqar, who was to be repatriated with the fishermen died in a hospital in Karachi on Saturday due to an illness.

"According to officials at Landhi jail the Indian prisoner had complained about high fever and chest problems and his condition deteriorated last week so he was sent to the hospital where he passed away due to apparent lung infection," he said.

An official of Edhi Welfare Trust, which usually arranges for the safe transportation of these Indian fishermen to Lahore and provides other help in jails, said that Zulfiqar's death was not a mystery as con-

ditions in the Landhi and Malir jails are far from ideal and prisoners with poor health and chronic ailments struggle to get regular proper treatment.

"Prison doctors or the hospital are generally not equipped to deal with serious ailments and recommend sending the patient to hospital but sometimes it is too late," the official said.

According to the Pakistan India People's Forum for Peace and Democracy, at present 631 Indian fishermen and one civilian prisoner are still in the Landhi and Malir jails in Karachi despite completing their prison sentences.

Adil Sheikh, who works with the forum in Karachi, said that these Indian fishermen all ended up in Pakistani jails after being arrested for allegedly violating the marine territorial demarcation treaty between Pakistan and India.

"Nearly all of them are poor illiterate people," he added.

In the past as well, a few Indian civilian prisoners have died in hospitals because of illnesses, as per prison authorities.

A total of 654 Indian fishermen are languishing in Karachi jails while an estimated 83 Pakistani fishermen are in Indian jails. Out of the 654 Indian fishermen, 631 have completed their sentences and are awaiting repatriation.

Pakistan and India regularly arrest rival fishermen for violating the maritime boundary, which is poorly marked at some points. (PTI)
