Seniority can't be claimed merely on basis of some entries reflected in service book: HC

JAMMU, May 18: Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court has held that seniority cannot be claimed merely on the basis of some entries reflected in the service book.

This significant judgment has been passed in a petition seeking issuance of appropriate writs for fixation of petitioner's seniority, proper placement in the final seniority list and consequential release of his retrospective promotional benefits.

The case set up by the petitioner was that he came to be appointed as Junior Clerk against a clear vacancy on 08.11.1974 and in pursuance thereof, he joined at Srinagar on 11.08.1974. Since his basic appointment did not make it clear whether his appointment was on regular or ad hoc basis, he made a representation to the Director General of Civil Aviation for clarification so that he could be regularized with effect from 08.11.1974—the date he joined at Aeronautical Communication Station (ACS), Srinagar.

Request of the petitioner was considered and vide order No. 12020/21/76-ES dated 09.07.1976 passed by DGCA, concerned officer made entry in his service book.

After hearing Youvraj Bhushan for the petitioner Bushan Lal Koul (now dead) whereas Advocate Inderjeet Gupta with Advocate Yatin Mahajan for the Airport Authority, Justice Rajesh Sekhri observed, "an ad hoc appointment is nothing but fortuitous and it does not confer benefit of seniority for the period the employee was on ad hoc employment and an employee appointed on ad hoc basis is not entitled, in law, to have his ad hoc service counted for the purpose of fixation

of seniority". "Petitioner has failed to produce any order of regularization of his service from 08.11.1974 and as per the seniority list on record, the petitioner stands regularized with effect from 12.05.1980. Seniority cannot be claimed merely on the basis of some entries reflected in the service book. Petitioner is not only obliged to show that order of regularization, if any, was passed by an authority competent to make regular appointment to the service in compliance with the rules and regulations, but also to establish that he was entitled, in law, to have benefit of seniority for the period he was serving on ad hoc basis", High Court said.

"Petitioner, in the present case, has failed on both the counts. Therefore, petitioner is not found entitled, in law, to have his ad hoc service counted for the purpose of fixation of his seniority", High Court while dismissing the petition being devoid of any merit. Justice Sekhri also expressed displeasure over the manner respondents, particularly, DGCA have dealt with the controversy. "Since there were allegations and counter allegations regarding manipulation of service record of the petitioner, respondents were obliged to initiate a detailed enquiry into the case in order to ascertain the truth or falsehood", High Court said.

"Respondents could be directed to make an in-depth probe to fix the responsibility, however, since the controversy dates back to the year 1976, the present petition came to be filed in this court in 2003—20 years back and particularly since the petitioner has already passed away, it may not be proper to do so, at this length of time", High Court said.

9 injured as car falls into gorge

RAJOURI, May 18: Nine passengers were injured when a car rolled down into a gorge on Rajouri-Budhal road in Kotranka area of district Rajouri today.

Official sources said that an Eco car carrying nine passengers, fell into nearly 50-feet deep gorge in Kandli Gala area under Kotranka Police jurisdiction on Budhal road. The injured were rescued by the locals of the area and police and then shifted to Kotranka hospital for treatment. Out of the nine, 4 injured were referred to GMC Hospital Rajouri for better treatment.

Police said that mishap took

place when Eco car bearing registration number JK11E-1150 was carrying passengers from Kotranka to Rajouri and the driver lost control over the vehicle at a sharp turn at Kandli Gala and the car fell into a gorge.

Rs 11.47 cr released under Phase-II of Central Scheme H&ME allocates funds to GMC of Srinagar, Jammu to boost PG seats

SRINAGAR, May 18: The Health & Medical Education (H&ME) today allocated a sum of over Rs 11 crore to the Government Medical College (GMC) of Srinagar and Jammu, under the centrally sponsored scheme 'Strengthening and Upgradation of State Government Medical Colleges to Increase PG Seats, Phase-II'.

The H&ME has issued an order for the release of Rs 11 crore and 47 lakhs, instructing the Director of Finance at the H&ME Department to make the funds available to the Principal of GMC, Srinagar and Jammu during the current financial year 2023-24.

According to available details, Rs 3.33 crore has been allocated to GMC, Srinagar under the General Component, along with Rs 1.13 crore under the SC Component and Rs 67 lakh under the ST Component. Consequently, a total of Rs 5 crore and 13 lakh has been released to GMC, Srinagar under this scheme.

Similarly, GMC, Jammu has received Rs 4.13 crore under the General Component, Rs 1.39 crore under the SC Component, and Rs 82 lakh under the ST Component, bringing the total released amount for GMC, Jammu to Rs 6 crore and 34 lakh.

5 more wine shops booked in Jammu City for over-charging

JAMMU, May 18: The Excise Department team today booked five more wine shops at Gandhi Nagar, Satwari, Gangyal and Residency Road in Jammu City for violation of license conditions/over-charging.

Official sources said that taking cognizance of public com-

plaints that many wine shop operators/salesmen were over charging from the customers, Excise Commissioner, J&K, Pankaj Kumar Sharma, directed his staff including ETOs and Inspectors to conduct surprise inspections of the wine shops and take action in this regard.

A team led by Deputy Excise Commissioner, Executive, (Jammu) Kusum Sharma, comprising of ETO South Ankit Gupta, Inspector Sunil Sharma

conducted surprise inspection at various wine shops at Gandhi Nagar, Trikuta Nagar, Satwari, Narwal and adjoining areas today. During inspection emphasis was laid on display of MRP and availability of digital mode of payment like, UPI.

During the surprise inspection, four wine shops- Yashpal Wine Shop, Shilpa Khajuria Wine Shop, Sumit Sudan Wine Shop and Aruna Kumari Wine Shop were booked Under Section 49 (b) of J&K Excise Act, 1958 by the team in Jammu South.

Another team led by ETO North, Jammu, booked Sudesh Singh Shan Wine Shop at Residency Road, in Excise Range North for over-charging/ violation of License conditions. These shops have been recommended for heavy penalty/fine to the Dy Excise Commissioner, Jammu.

The Excise Commissioner has appealed to the customers to use digital mode of payments at wine shops and in case of any violation immediately report to concerned Excise Officer so that immediate necessary action is taken against violators.
