## Asia Cup India beat Nepal by 10 wickets

**PALLEKELE (SRI LANKA), Sept 4:** India qualified for the Super 4 stage of the Asia Cup after beating Nepal by 10 wickets under the Duckworth/Lewis method in a rain-interrupted match here on Monday.

Chasing a revised target of 145 in 23 overs, captain Rohit Sharma (74 not out) and Shubman Gill (67 not out) struck unbeaten half-centuries to take India home with 17 balls to spare. India reached 147 for no loss in 20.1 overs.

Earlier, chasing 231, India were 17 for no loss in 2.1 overs when it started raining heavily, forcing the game's second interruption. The match restarted after a break of two hours.

Sent into bat, Nepal were 178 for six in 37.5 overs when the heavens opened up first time in the middle of the match. Play resumed after about one hour but no overs were lost. Nepal were then bowled out for 230 in 48.2 overs. Opener Aasif Sheikh made 58 off 97 balls, while Kushal Bhurtel scored a 25-ball 38. Ravindra Jadeja was the most successful Indian bowler with figures of 3/40.

## BCCI officials in Pakistan Cricket and politics shouldn't be mixed, urges Shukla

**AMRITSAR/LAHORE, Sept 4:** Stadium in Lahore. The duo will watch a couple of Super Four Games on Tuesday and Wednesday.

The last time an Indian cricket team travelled to Pakistan was back in 2008 for the Asia Cup. Pakistan last hosted India for a bilateral series in 2006. Their cricket team last visited India for a bilateral white-ball series in 2012.

The BCCI had refused to send its team to Pakistan for the Asia Cup, which led to a bi-national 'Hybrid Model' arrangement. But in a heartening gesture, the BCCI approved former Test player Binny and Congressman Shukla's participation in a dinner hosted by the Governor of Punjab province of Pakistan. (PTI)

For the first time in 17 years, two senior BCCI office-bearers - president Roger Binny and vice-president Rajeev Shukla -- travelled to Pakistan and reached Lahore on Monday after crossing the Attari-Wagah border, honouring the PCB's invitation to watch Asia Cup there.

While seasoned politician Shukla urged people "not to mix politics with cricket", a beaming PCB supremo Zaka Ashraf hoped that the acceptance of invitation by the BCCI is a welcome step towards improving the relations between the two cricket boards.
