office by the Constitution. He accepts the sovereignty of India," Sibal told the bench, also comprising Justices Sanjay Kishan Kaul, Sanjiv Khanna, BR Gavai and Surya Kant.

Earlier in the day, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Centre, told the bench that the Central Government wanted Lone to apologise for raising 'Pakistan zindabad' (long live Pakistan) slogan in the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly in 2018.

Lone has to state that he owes allegiance to the Constitution and apologises for raising the slogan on the floor of the House, the law officer said, while pointing to the matter having been brought to the court's notice by a Kashmiri Pandit group.

NGO 'Roots in Kashmir', which claims to be a group of Kashmiri Pandit youths, has questioned the credentials of Lone, claiming he was a supporter of secessionist forces.

The moment bench re-assembled in the post-lunch session, Justice Kaul pointed to Sibal that lawyers for respondents (those supporting abrogation of Article 370) have submitted that what Lone allegedly said was "not in sync".

Sibal said, "I'm not concerned with that. If he has said it, in what circumstances, is it recorded, you ask him for an affidavit. I won't stand for him in this court, if he doesn't file an affidavit."

The CJ then told the senior lawyer that Lone will have to file an affidavit that he unconditionally accepts the sovereignty of India and that Jammu and Kashmir is an integral part of India.

"How can he say otherwise? He is a member of Parliament. And if he has said it, at my level, I deprecate it. I personally don't subscribe to what he has said," Sibal said.

Mehta said it is one thing that Sibal deprecates it and asked whether Lone, a litigant, file an affidavit to say that "he does not support terrorism and secessionism. No citizen can have any objection in filing that."

The CJ then told Sibal, "When he invokes the jurisdiction

of our court under Article 32 of the Constitution, we take it that he necessarily abides by the Constitution. We want to have it from him in the affidavit that he unconditionally accepts that J&K is an integral part of India and that he abides by and owes allegiance to the Constitution of India."

Sibal said the alleged incident is of the J-K Assembly session in 2018 and there were other people also who were present.

"I was not aware of it until this morning, when someone pointed it out to me. Let's not go into all these. There was a Speaker of the Assembly from BJP who asked him to say something. He was asked to say something which people ask other people to say on the streets of this country. Why do we need to go into all this? Let's focus on our legal issue," Sibal said without elaborating further.

The bench then told Sibal to ask Lone to file a short affidavit by Tuesday, and said it likes to hear different voices and has heard people from Srinagar and other parts of Jammu and Kashmir.

"We will hear you (Sibal) for Lone as well. There's no difficulty. He has come to our court, we're duty bound to hear his submissions. All that we want to say here is that we welcome everyone here. We heard people from across the political spectrum in J&K. We like to hear different voices," the CJ said.

Attorney General R Venkatarani said a person seeking to enforce his fundamental rights should have faith in the Constitution.

Sibal then continued with his legal submission in his rejoinder arguments and said he has at the outset stated they have not challenged the sovereignty of India and insisted that Jammu and Kashmir is an integral part of India.

Several petitions challenging the abrogation of the provisions of Article 370 and the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, 2019, which split the erstwhile State into two Union Territories - Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh - were referred to a Constitution bench in 2019. (PTI)

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HC frames Robkar against DLR

show cause as to why he be not punished for having committed contempt of court.

This significant order has been passed in a contempt petition filed by Nawab Din seeking directions to the State and its functionaries in the Forest Department for his regularization in Government service and release of salary with effect from September 2005.

"The case was contested by the State and this court while taking into consideration the claim of the petitioner and objections raised by the State-respondents decided the writ petition with the direction to the respondent to comply with the directions issued in SWP No.1641/01 and the orders passed in COA(S) No.25-A/02", Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul said.

After hearing both the sides, Justice Koul observed, "respondents in the petition and Suhail Hassain Tantray, who was implemented as respondent on the previous date of hearing, are not present", adding "they were required to remain present to show cause as to why the contempt proceedings be not initiated against them because they have prima facie shown willful disobedience of the orders passed by this court".

"Suhail Hassain Tantray by giving his opinion has committed gross contempt. There is no reason shown for their non-appearance. The judgment which is passed in the year 2012

has not been implemented and the non-compliance is willful. The new incumbents, who have appeared in the court today shall file compliance report. A week's time is granted to comply with the judgment in letter and spirit, failing which, they will have to face contempt proceedings", the High Court said.

AAG appearing on behalf of the respondents submitted that he has made an application for exemption of Suhail Hassain Tantray, Deputy Legal Remembrancer. "The opinion is contrary to the direction passed by the court and it appears that he has tried to outrage the judgment by giving such opinion. From the perusal of his opinion, it is clear that the judgment passed by this court will not be implemented. The application which is stated to have been filed for exemption of the respondent, is not listed today. Even otherwise, having regard to his conduct and the opinion given by him regarding the implementation of the judgment he would not be entitled to exempt", Justice Koul said.

High Court held that prima facie a case is made out that he has committed contempt of court and directed Registry to frame Robkar against the respondent-Suhail Hassain Tantray and after framing the Robkar issue notice to him to show cause as to why he be not punished for having committed contempt of court.

Centre likely to call LAB, KDA Reps for talks after Kargil elections

senior leader of Leh Apex Body but the meeting couldn't be held as LAB leadership as well as others leaders were busy with the visit of The Dalai Lama.

"There has been consensus on meeting which could take place either by the end of this month or early next month," the sources said, adding the meeting could be fruitful as the Government of India is positive towards the issues of Ladakh except certain demands to which it was averse.

Four-point agenda of the LAB and KDA include grant of Sixth Schedule status and Statehood for Ladakh, two Lok Sabha seats-one each for Leh and Kargil - and job opportunities for the locals.

They have also demanded constitution of the Public Service Commission (PSC) for Ladakh but said if it can't be constituted, Ladakh should be included in the PSC of Jammu and Kashmir on the pattern of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court.

However, they have stressed, the Ladakh Resident Certificate (LRC) should be made mandatory for all kind of recruitments.

The Central Government has ruled out Statehood.

The LAB and KDA leaders to whom the Excelsior spoke were confident that the Central Government especially the Union Home Ministry headed by Amit Shah which has been dealing with issues of Ladakh through Minister of State for Home Nityanand Rai will take favourable view of all issues.

Parliament elections are due in next eight months now. The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) had won Ladakh Lok Sabha seat, which

is lone constituency in the Union Territory, for two consecutive terms in 2014 and 2019. In 2014, Thupstap Chhewang, who now heads LAB as well as Ladakh Buddhist Association (LBA), won the seat for BJP while in 2019, Jamiyang Tsering Namgyal retained the seat for the party.

In the last meeting held in New Delhi on June 19, Union MoS Home Nityanand Rai and the top MMA officials listened to issues raised by LAB and KDA and assured that the talks will go on and the High Powered Committee (HPC) meeting will be called.

The LAB and KDA have reservations over the HPC which headed by Nityanand Rai was constituted by the MMA on January 4 this year. They had objected to inclusion of some leaders and wanted that representatives of LAB and KDA in the HPC should be finalized with their consent.

Moreover, they were of the view that their agenda should be part of the HPC which is precondition for their attending the next meeting.

The MMA had on January 3 set up a High Powered Committee headed by Union Minister of State for Home Nityanand Rai comprising then LG of Ladakh RK Mathur, Ladakh MP Jamiyang Tsering Namgyal and many leaders from Leh and Kargil.

However, the LAB and KDA in their meeting on January 7 decided to boycott the HPC on the ground that neither their agenda nor the names of members recommended by them were part of the HPC. Later, the LAB and KDA sent names to the Union Home Ministry which they wanted to be included in the HPC.

Occupants to surrender migrant property before appeal: HC

The petitioners had challenged the order of eviction before the FC and the same was dismissed. The petitioners challenged the order of eviction passed by District Magistrate and order of dismissing their appeal by FC before the High Court in two separate writ petitions.

Justice Sanjay Dhar while dismissing both the petitions in a common judgment said that it was obligatory upon the petitioners to surrender the possession of the land in question so that their appeal could have been considered by the Appellate Authority but the petitioners, without complying with this condition, filed the appeal before the Financial Commissioner.

"The same could not have been entertained and, therefore, the Financial Commissioner has rightly held it to be not maintainable. The impugned order passed by the Financial Commissioner, therefore, calls for no interference. I do not find any merit in these writ petitions. The same are accordingly dismissed. The interim order, if any, shall stand vacated", Justice Dhar concluded.

The DM Shopian while exercising his powers under Section 5 of the Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Immovable Property (Preservation, Protection and Restraint on Distress Sales) Act, 1997 had directed the Naib Tehsildar, Kanjiullah to take possession of the land in question, which includes the land measuring 25 kanals 17 marlas and land measuring 8 kanals situated at Ramnagri, Shopian.

According to the petitioners, Billo, Kasana and others, the land in question is not a migrant property as the same was under the cultivation/tenancy of ancestors of the petitioners even before Kharief 1971 and that presently the land is under their cultivation and as such, the eviction order passed by the

District Magistrate is without jurisdiction.

Their contention before the court was that the District Magistrate has not conducted any enquiry to ascertain as to whether the possession of the petitioners over the land in question can be termed as unauthorized nor made any enquiry as to whether the private respondents are migrants as according to them, the private respondents had left the Valley even prior to 1st November, 1989 as such are not migrants.

The authorities, however, in rebuttal submitted that a detailed enquiry was conducted by the District Magistrate, Shopian before passing the impugned order and there is no illegality in the order passed by the District Magistrate or in the order passed by the Financial Commissioner.

"It has been submitted that a detailed enquiry was conducted, during the course of which a report was called from the Tehsildar, Shopian, who vide his report dated 25.08.2014 has clearly stated that the land in question is recorded in the name of Deena Nath and Shambo Nath. It has also been submitted that the petitioners have unauthorizedly occupied the land in question", read the objections.

Court on passing of order of eviction said the District Magistrate is authorized to take such steps as may be necessary for preservation and protection of such property which includes eviction of an unauthorized occupant. "It is further indicated in the impugned order that the petitioners claim that they have paid rent in respect of the said land to the private respondents but as per the report of the Tehsildar, the possession of the land in question was taken over by the petitioners after the migration of the land owners", read the judgment.

Militant killed after taking shelter in a house, associate too trapped

Sources said after security personnel cordoned off the house and rescued civilians, they challenged the militants to come out and surrender but they fired on Army, CRPF and police who retaliated leading to the gun battle in which one militant was immediately killed while two security personnel including a jawan each from Army and Police were injured.

The exchange of fire between the two sides stopped tonight. Due to darkness, the security forces are exercising caution and not moving inside the house to find out the fate of the second militant, who is also believed to have been killed, they said.

Two Army and police personnel injured in the encounter have been hospitalized and their condition was stable.

Searches which were suspended in the area tonight will be resumed early tomorrow morning. As there was no fire from the other side, the second militant appeared to have died. However, the second casualty will be known only when the searches are complete.

Both the militants were believed to be part of a group of four militants last spotted at Gundna Khwas in Rajouri's Budhal area by the Village Defence Committee (VDC) members on August 5.

One of the militants was

killed at the spot while his injured associate was eliminated at Dhakkikot in Reasi district on August 18. Two militants were at large and were appeared to be same who were trapped at Gali Sohamb today.

Both the militants were in possession of deadly weapons, explosives and ammunition. They were part of the Lashkar group which was planning to revive militancy in Rajouri, Poonch and Reasi districts, the officials said.

The border district of Poonch along with nearby Rajouri has witnessed several encounters this year, resulting in the killing of around 20 militants and 10 security personnel.

Most of the terrorists were killed while attempting to sneak into India from across the border, according to officials.

Rajouri and Poonch districts have witnessed spurt in terror attacks this year. While seven civilians from minorities were killed by the militants at Dhangri in Rajouri on first day of the year, five bravehearts of Army sacrificed their lives in a terror attack at Mendhar on April 20 and another five at Kandi forest of Rajouri on May 5.

Troops had later eliminated four militants in Surankote on July 18 and one each at Gundna Khwas, Budhal on August 5 and Dhakkikot in Mahore area of Reasi on August 18.

Reconsider support to 'One China' policy: Omar

Omar Abdullah said today if China does not accept "one India" policy, New Delhi should reconsider support to Beijing's 'One China' policy.

Asking why China should have a problem with any meeting in Jammu and Kashmir or any other part of India, the National Conference vice president said if China continues with this stance, India should also raise questions on Tibet, Taiwan and Hong Kong.

"I think it's extremely unfortunate that the Government of India keeps repeating its (adherence to) One China policy yet for some reason, China doesn't reciprocate. "Our foreign policy should always be based on reciprocity. If China doesn't accept a one India policy, then why should India accept One China policy," Omar, a former Minister of State of External Affairs, said.

"It shouldn't be one-sided that only China can raise questions about what happens in India and not vice versa. I believe that if China is going to continue to do this, then India must also revisit its One China policy," he told reporters.

China, a G20 member, and Pakistan had objected to the decision to hold G20 events in Kashmir, which they call "disputed". China also disputes India's sovereignty over Arunachal Pradesh. India has consistently dismissed such claims by China and Pakistan.

When asked about the issue, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had in an exclusive interview to PTI late last week said, "Such a question would be valid if we had refrained from conducting meetings in those venues. Ours is such a vast, beautiful and diverse nation. When G20 meetings are happening, isn't it natural that meetings will be held in every part of our country."

Dismissing Chinese claims, India had then said that it was free to hold meetings on its own territory.

By the time India's G20 presidency term ends, Modi had said, over 220 meetings would have taken place across 60 cities in all 28 States and eight Union Territories, and added that over one lakh participants from around 125 nationalities would witness the skills of Indians. (PTI)

Traffic being restored on Jammu-Pkt NH today

NHAI has completed alternative causeway type bridge over river Tarnah near Dyalachak and Chadwal towns in district Kathua.

Official sources said that highway which was earlier being restored on August 25, could not be made operational as on the intervening night of August 23-24, heavy flood in Tarnah washed away a major portion of causeway type bridge. This happened perhaps for the fourth time.

Project Director, Jammu-Lakhanpur section of National Highway, Yashpal Jadon said that this causeway-type bridge, nearly 500 mt in length now finally has been completed. "We had shortage of big pipes which were procured from Ludhiana in Punjab. Over 150 pipes were used to raise this culvert type bridge" he added.

The PD said tomorrow, he along with team of engineers will visit the bridge site at Dyalachak and after having on the spot assessment will allow movement of light and medium passenger vehicles (Minibuses).

The Board discussed various ongoing and upcoming projects including creation of new infrastructure and maintenance and restoration of the existing ones.

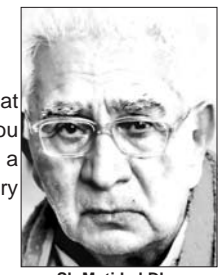
