Add troops deployed in Rajouri, Poonch to counter terror threat

JGundna Khwas encounter in Darhal and Dhakkikot and Chassana in Reasi district, the VDGs played very vital role in gathering information about the militants and in eliminating them.

There have been reports that nearly a dozen militants are active in the twin border districts of Rajouri and Poonch in addition to their four associates who were killed in Surankote and three others who were eliminated at Darhal, Dhakkikot and Chassana.

However, Pakistan continued to make attempts to push trained militants into the Indian territory. Majority of infiltration attempts have been foiled by the troops in which nearly 22 militants were killed this year.

It was on January 1 when the militants caused one of the major terror attacks after several years at Dhangri in Rajouri district killing seven civilians of minority community. On April 20, five Army bravehearts lost their lives in a terror attack at Bhatta Durrian in Mendhar tehsil of Poonch district while five para commandos were killed in another attack at Kandi forests in Rajouri district on May 5.

However, since then, Army and Police have taken full control of the situation and eliminated and apprehended many militants.

- The instant case was lodged in this forum on 26-06-2023 by Range Officer Gulabgarh vide no.259/GG Dated 26/06/2023 wherein the forest officials seized fir scants 42 no.s and 02 dry Fir poles seized from Nazir Ahmed S/o Ghulam Mir R/o Manjrikote Tehsil Mahore District Reasi and 37 fir scants from Nissar Ahmed S/o Shabir Ahmed R/o Manjrikote Tehsil Mahore District Reasi.
- That intimation of seizure was sent to the Hon'ble Chief Judicial Magistrate Reasi vide no. DFO/MFD/AO/1172 Dated 27/06/2023.
- Proceedings of the case started in this forum on 27/06/2023.
- That Range Officer Gulabgarh vide his no. 257/GG dated 26.06.2023 submitted detailed enquiry report mentioning seizure of fir scants 42 no.s and 02 dry Fir poles seized from Nazir Ahmed and 37 fir scants from Nissar Ahmed. The accused had no valid documents of this illicit timber.
- That summons was issued to Sh. Nissar Ahmed S/o Shabir Ahmed R/o Manjrikote Tehsil Mahore District Reasi vide No. DFO/MFD/1180-82 dated 27.06.2023 and Nazir Ahmed S/o Ghulam Mir R/o Manjrikote Tehsil Mahore District Reasi vide No.-DFO/MFD/1174-76 dated 27.06.2023 to appear in the court of Authorized Officer for recording the statement on 04.07.2023.
- That Sh. Nissar Ahmed S/o Shabir Ahmed R/o Manjrikote Tehsil Mahore District Reasi and Nazir Ahmed S/o Ghulam Mir R/o Manjrikote Tehsil Mahore District Reasi could not produce any valid document in support of timber seized from their possession.
- That Range Officer Gulabgarh recorded his statement on 06.09.2023 that seizure of Dry Fir scants 42 no.s and 02 dry, Fir poles seized from Nazir Ahmed and 37 dry fir scants from Nissar Ahmed.

The accused had no valid documents of this illicit timber and accordingly Range Officer requested for confiscation of seized scants.

Persuing facts mentioned above and in violation of section 26 (e), 26 (f), 42(1), of IFA 1927 read with section 52& 54 of Indian Forest ACT, 1927, Seized 42 Fir dry scants and 02 Fir dry poles seized from Nazir Ahmed S/o Ghulam Mir R/o Manjrikote Tehsil Mahore District Reasi and 37 Fir dry scants seized from Nissar Ahmed S/o Shabir Ahmed R/o Manjrikote Tehsil Mahore District Reasi are hereby confiscated with immediate effect.

JAMMU, Sept 10: Kashmiri Pandit Conference (KPC) in a meeting at Delhi today has reiterated the demand of one place settlement for Kashmiri Pandits in Valley by carving out a separate Kashyap State which will be the only solution to their long standing problems.

The meeting was chaired by KPC chief, Kundan Kashmiri who while highlighting the issues of displaced Pandits said that the community has full faith in the leadership of PM, Narendra Modi to settle this long standing issue of the exiled Pandits.

He also demanded that the Government should punish all those who were responsible for killing of Kashmiri Pandits since 1989 under law of the land and constitute a Commission to identify the elements who were responsible for the genocide of KPs.

Kashmiri said that KPC has decided to observe the Martyrs Day of September 14 as 'Black Day'. He also appealed the community to observe this day as Black Day by wearing black badges and switching off lights besides exposing the tormentors of the community.
